I am writing in support of bill H-5351 that proposes all medical professionals and aesthetic professionals in Rhode Island may work and delegate to the full extent of their scope of practice.

The RIDOH is limiting access to the services I have been receiving from my current aesthetic practitioner. I have been told I will no longer be able to receive microneedling and dysport injections from my nurse practitioner and aesthetician. I have been seeing both of these providers for two years now and we have built a relationship where I feel confident and safe receiving these treatments.

I do not want to lose my right to choose my provider. I wish to continue to receive my aesthetic care at a medical spa from my RN and esthetician. I do not want to be forced to drive to neighboring states to seek these services. Aesthetics is a fast growing, profitable industry that can strengthen the RI economy, but current restrictions on scope of practice will drive it from our state. The RIDOH guidelines are limiting the growth of aesthetic medicine in our state without increasing safety.
