I am writing in strong support of Bill H5351. As an emergency room nurse, I recently obtained certifications in cosmetic injectables, only to learn that nurses are now restricted from performing these procedures. This decision is perplexing, as registered nurses routinely handle far greater responsibilities in their daily practice. It is difficult to understand why cosmetic injectables would fall outside a nurse's scope when we are extensively trained in patient care, safety, and medical procedures.

Additionally, I am a patient at Citrine Aesthetics in Cumberland, Rhode Island, where nurses previously provided my Botox and filler treatments. Their skill, training, and experience are unmatched, and I trust them more than providers I have visited elsewhere. These professionals are certified, highly trained, and have years of experience in the field. The recent restrictions should not be in effect, as they undermine the expertise of qualified practitioners and limit access to safe, regulated aesthetic treatments.

I urge you to reconsider the guidelines implemented in July and support this bill so that nurses can continue providing cosmetic injectables under appropriate delegation.
