**Re: Support for H 7083**

On behalf of OSHEAN, Inc and its membership of over 160 RI Community Anchor Institutions, I write in support of H 7083 and the establishment of the Broadband Development Program.

The establishment of a state coordinator for broadband has been a significant weak spot in the state's efforts to build the next generation digital infrastructure. Broadband is the foundation of the digital transformation of our economic, research and education communities and currently, RI has no central council coordinating efforts across the state. Federal granting authorities are requiring states to have an established broadband office to coordinate the upcoming broadband grants.

Rhode Island is one of only two states without a broadband office and as such suffers in the developments necessary to keep pace with the changing times. The pandemic has taught everyone the importance of the networks necessary for supporting remote learning, telemedicine, and a remote workforce. The complexity of issues facing the state in the coming years regarding the impact of IT technology cannot be underestimated and we believe a coordinating body focused on the myriad of issues with broadband access is the perfect place to have the conversation. This is a continually evolving environment and no single perspective can inform to the level necessary. We must have multiple policy, technical and market perspectives, hence the requirement for the establishment of the council.

The state benefitted greatly when Broadband RI was funded and working under the Federal BTOP program and we lost an important piece of work when we chose not to continue the office when BTOP ended. Currently there is no central body for agencies nor cities and towns to work with, no statewide broadband mapping program and no one to help coordinate the funding landscape. The funding landscape for broadband is entering a "once in a century" opportunity phase and federal officials have made it clear they are looking to state broadband offices to be a critical piece of the granting process. We, at OSHEAN, implore the Senate to consider rapid approval of H 7083 to position our state properly for our digital future.
