Re: H. 7051 Shooting Range Zoning

Dear Chair Craven and Members of the Judiciary Committee:

The National Shooting Sports Foundation ("NSSF") is the non-profit trade association for America's firearms, ammunition, hunting and recreational shooting sports industry. Our manufacturer members make the firearms used by law-abiding Rhode Island sportsmen, the U.S. military and law enforcement agencies throughout Rhode Island.

H. 7051 Position: Opposed

This letter is to express our strong opposition to H.7051, regulating gun range operations. The bill seeks to essentially eliminate outdoor ranges within a one-mile radius of any school in the state. This bill is a solution in search of a problem. There have been zero instances of any issues pertaining to outdoor ranges and schools anywhere in the state. This bill will further burden an already over-regulated sector of the business community and most likely lead to the closure of ranges.

NSSF, on behalf of our thousands of member shooting ranges, promotes the development of target shooting facilities and protects the interests of these facilities by providing trusted leadership in information, communication, and partnerships among ranges, industry and communities. We work tirelessly to advance participation in and a better understanding of hunting and the shooting sports; promote the safe and responsible use of firearms and foster a climate supportive of America's traditional firearms rights.

Ranges located throughout Rhode Island provide gun-owners and sportsmen safe places to practice and pass on their heritage to future generations.
