As frontline healthcare providers, we witness the devastating consequences of gun violence firsthand, and we believe that these measures are critical steps towards reducing firearm-related injuries and deaths in our communities.

First and foremost, we urge you to prioritize the enactment of legislation mandating the safe storage of firearms in households across Rhode Island. Time and again, we have seen the tragic outcomes that result from the improper storage of guns, particularly when they are accessible to children and individuals who should not have access to them. The Family Room in our emergency departments serves as a somber reminder of the lives lost due to preventable accidents and acts of violence involving firearms. By requiring gun owners to store their firearms securely in locked containers or with locking devices, we can significantly reduce the risk of unintentional shootings and unauthorized access to firearms, especially among vulnerable populations such as children and individuals in crisis.

Furthermore, we wholeheartedly endorse the ban on assault weapons in Rhode Island. Assault weapons are designed for rapid and efficient killing, and their widespread availability poses a grave threat to public safety. As emergency physicians, we have witnessed the devastating impact of shootings and other acts of violence perpetrated with assault weapons. These weapons of war have no place in our communities, and their continued availability only serves to escalate the lethality of gun violence incidents. By enacting a ban on assault weapons, Rhode Island can take a proactive stance towards preventing future tragedies and safeguarding the well-being of its residents.

In conclusion, we urge you to support legislation that promotes the safe storage of firearms and bans assault weapons in Rhode Island. As healthcare providers committed to saving lives, we believe that these measures are essential components of a comprehensive approach to reducing gun violence and protecting public health.
