I am writing to urge you to support common-sense gun safety bills that will make all Rhode Islanders safer. As gun violence devastates communities across our nation, we must do everything we can here in Rhode Island to prevent gun homicides, suicides, and injuries.

Specifically I urge you to prioritize Support for: H7373 (Caldwell), which would require all firearms to be stored securely when not under the control of their owner or another authorized user and promote efforts to educate gun owners, parents and students about the benefits of secure gun storage. Bill H7217 (Knight) would prohibit the future manufacture, sale, transfer, and possession of assault weapons, while providing a pathway for current owners of assault weapons to keep the ones they currently have.
