## I am writing to state my opposition to House bill H7373

There is already a law targeting the consideration and protection of children from firearms on the books. Every responsible owner of firearms that I know keeps their firearms secure for several reasons, including the protection of children that may be present. Restricting access by lawful citizens to their life-saving firearms <u>IN THEIR HOME</u> will not stop reckless people from being reckless.

This bill was in committee a couple of years ago, and the Speaker of House wanted to compromise by converting the bill to allow for a sales tax credit for anyone purchasing a safe.
