RE: House Bill No. H5644 Relating to Motor Vehicle – Nontransparent Windshield and Windows.

Dear Chairman Craven:

I am writing on behalf of the Rhode Island Police Chiefs Association (RIPCA) to voice our strong support for the House bill referenced above regarding the increase of fines for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> offenses of sunscreen material in violation of 31-23.3-2 R.I.G.L.

The focus of our objection to allowing sunscreen and/or non-transparent material on the front windshield and side windows are for safety reasons. Dark tints, especially at night or in low-light conditions can significantly reduce the driver's ability to see pedestrians, cyclists and other vehicles. Secondly, there is a strong public safety concern, as dark tints allow occupants to move without detection, causing risks for both officers and occupants. Dark tint also makes it easier for criminals to evade detection, conceal contraband or hide weapons.

Thank you for allowing me to submit this written testimony on behalf of the RIPCA and as always, I am available for any follow-up questions you or the committee may have, and we are willing to continue discussions with the bill's sponsors.
