RE: H 5926 An Act Relating to Animals and Animal Husbandry – Cruelty to Animals

Dear Chairman Craven,

Thank you for providing the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) the opportunity to comment on H 5926, which would create a cause of action for pet owners to seek damages when another person causes injury or death to their pet. DEM is not taking a position on this legislation but wishes to provide the Committee with information about potential ramifications if it becomes law.


DEM believes that this legislation would result in the cost of veterinary care increasing at a time when it is already high due to a shortage of veterinarians. Allowing veterinarians to be sued for damages above the value of an animal will likely lead to insurance companies increasing the cost of liability insurance coverage and these costs will be passed on to pet owners. A potential indirect effect of this legislation is veterinarians adopting the practice of “defensive medicine” whereby they may be inclined to order tests or procedures that are not medically necessary to shield themselves from liability.

Furthermore, we note that this bill broadly applies to any individual who provides services to pets including pet sitters, dog walkers, groomers, and trainers, among others. Any individuals or entities not required to be licensed may lack appropriate insurance and therefore could have considerably liability exposure if this proposal becomes law. For example, an individual agreeing to watch their neighbor’s dog or cat while they are on vacation could face liability exposure not covered by their existing insurance.
