Re: House Bill #5900: An Relating to Motor and Other Vehicles – Motor Vehicles Offenses

Dear Chairman Craven:

I write on behalf of the Judiciary to express support for House Bill #5900, scheduled to be heard this evening before the House Judiciary Committee. If enacted, this bill would "clean up" and clarify R.I. Gen. Law §31-27-4, "Reckless driving and other offenses against public safety" by creating separate and distinct criminal classifications of felony and misdemeanor reckless driving offenses. The current statute does not distinguish between a felony and misdemeanor offense. Without separated categories the Judiciary's electronic filing system is unable to "code" the event as a misdemeanor or felony, and law enforcement agencies cannot file a reckless driving complaint reflecting the criminal classification.

I ask that the House Judiciary Committee consider passage of this legislation. Thank you for the opportunity to express the Judiciary's support for this bill.
