Chair Person Craven and House Judiciary Committee,

I am writing in opposition to and support of the above bills. While I would like to dissect each bill and share in detail why I oppose or support them, I know there will be many testifying who feel as I do so I will let those who may be better versed in firearms, statistics, and constitutional law convey my sentiments on the specifics of these bills.

As a somewhat new father, I want to share that I hope that you truly consider the long-term implications of H5436 and that we cannot control or know what the future will bring.
