I am writing to express my intense opposition to the deceptive bill proposal, called the Assault Weapons Ban. In addition to the undeniable, constitutional right that the Governor and others have repeatedly attempted to usurp from law-abiding citizens, it is common sense/knowledge that a firearm in itself is not a weapon. While unloaded, and securely stored in a lockbox, a gun cannot remove itself, load itself, aim itself, and discharge itself. It is a tool like any other. Why not work equally with both anti-gun groups, 2nd-amendment groups, and law enforcement to draft feasible and justified legislation? Usurping control of law-abiding citizens will never clean up the streets if that is the state's intended goal. The paraphrased definition of insanity is this, doing the same thing over and over and expecting different results. This legislation screams of insanity! Instead of focusing on banning certain firearms, I urge you to explore policies that address the actual sources of gun violence. These include enhancing background checks, improving mental health services, closing loopholes that enable the illegal sale of firearms here at home and across the border, and ensuring that law enforcement agencies have the necessary tools to keep our communities safe.

Please review the link below. Gifford's, the advocacy, and research organization focused on preventing gun violence, started due to the tragic shooting of Gabby Giffords. This is an antigun lobbyist group. Yet according to this reputable organization, it clearly shows that for every 100,000 deaths in Rhode Island, less than 5% are gun related.
