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I am testifying in strong support of House Bill 7185. This bill will improve safety and security for prescribers of essential medications for managing medication abortions, early pregnancy loss, and retained pregnancy tissue after delivery without endangering patients.

I have personally been targeted as someone who prescribes these medications. I have approached after testifying in support of reproductive health bills surrounding mifepristone and misoprostol prescription and asked for where I practice, where I live, and other personal details that made me extremely uncomfortable. While I have not let this deter me for creating better care and access for my patients, there are other providers who would be wary of their safety and the safety of their families if their personal name was on the prescription bottle. At the same time, if there are issues with the prescription, pharmacies need a phone number to contact with any questions. This bill provides a solid compromise between provider and patient safety.

I support H7185 because access to essential medications for reproductive care shouldn't depend on a provider wondering if they will be personally targeted for helping their patients using safe and efficacious treatments. With the current hostile political landscape for reproductive health, our state must do everything we can to stand for the fundamental right for people to be able to decide whether, when, and how to have children, and to allow providers to help their patients safely manage pregnancies and their potential complications. I urge the committee and legislature to vote favorably for H7185 to provide practice name, rather than personal name, of prescribers for medication abortion medications.
