It brings our state laws in line with federal guidelines for service animals and focuses ESA recognition on dogs and cats. Requiring an existing relationship with a local healthcare professional helps prevent abuse of the system.

Passing this bill will foster better understanding and more consistent application of ESA accommodations, ultimately benefiting both tenants with genuine needs and housing providers seeking clear and fair guidelines. Please support this legislation.
