To the Judiciary Committee Members,

**My name is Michael Luciano of Cranston, RI. Please find my written testimony on H7755:**

This bill adds prerequisites to lawful firearm purchasing/possession by requiring an applicant-facing safety training component and related process steps. I am opposed to this bill because it prohibits the lawful purchase of firearms without abiding by government restrictions. First and foremost, the RI and US Constitutions do not allow for government qualifications for the right to bear arms. Also, this bill does not describe who will teach the course(s), and when they will be available. If this bill passes into law, only those selected by government will be able to purchase firearms until the list of courses is released, the instructors are selected, designated courses are scheduled, and citizens pass the tests, so the majority of lawful firearms purchases will cease for some unknown reason period of time, which will certainly hurt businesses in the state. Also, there are no exemptions for NRA certified training instructors, NRA Range Safety Officers, NRA Chief Range Safety Officers who have already been trained above and beyond basic firearm safety training.
