Here we also have an egregious effort to derail our Second Amendment right's. Post Bruen and Heller, by Imposing or mandating a 1 million dollar liability policy as a condition of lawful ownership directly burdens our God given and Constitutional Right to Keep and Bear Arms. It is up to the government to prove that said law is consistent with the Nation's historical tradition of firearm regulations. In 2022-2023 from New Jersey's Liability Insurance requirement, (Koons v Platkin) the U.S. District court found it unconstitutional under Bruen, reasoning that it imposed an impermissible financial burden on the exercise of the right to bear arms for self- defense. Later in 2025, the Third Circuit affirmed the district court's injunction holding that it was inconsistent with the Nation's historical tradition of firearm regulation. Bottom line here is that this bill will see litigation almost immediately due to the unconstitutional violations and prior court rulings. I recommend to table this bill.
