Should this bill come to pass, it would have catastrophic consequences to not only my income. and ability to be able to support my family, but would also have far reaching negative effects on many sectors of business in my community which has relied on the hospitality and the food and beverage industry for decades. I can't honestly imagine how myself or my colleagues would be able to move forward and continue to keep up with today's cost of living and provide the basic necessities (mortgage and/or rent, groceries, utilities, automobile payments and upkeep, student loan payments, etc.) for our families without the income bracket that is currently able to be maintained through the tip credit.
