As a growing business, we need policies that support entrepreneurship, economic growth, and flexibility in business succession—not policies that impose additional government control over private enterprises. We urge you to oppose House Bill 5940 and Senate Bill 752 and instead focus on legislation that empowers businesses to succeed while respecting their autonomy.
