Re: H.7366, An Act Relating to Food and Drugs – Sanitation in Food Establishments

Dear Chairman Corvese,

The undersigned members of the Rhode Island Business Coalition write in support of House Bill 7366 which is an industry-led initiative to bolster the hospitality industry job training programs. We thank Representative McNamara for introducing this legislation.

H.7366 proposes a fifty-dollar fee on food establishments by the Department of Health that would be transferred to the Department of Labor and Training (DLT) to provide dedicated funding to hospitality industry workforce training grants. The Rhode Island Hospitality Association has had a long partnership with DLT and the Real Jobs Rhode Island program to provide training for the industry's workforce, including certified food and alcohol safety training programs.

The loss of additional federal funding for workforce training programs has put a strain on state funds dedicated for this purpose. H.7366 is an industry initiative to contribute more funding to job training programs at no additional cost to the state.

Thank you for your consideration of our position in support of H.7366.
