**Re: Support for HB 7958; An Act Relating to Labor and Labor Relations—Fair Employment Practices**

On behalf of Sullivan & McLaughlin Co. Inc., I write in strong support for HB 7958 requiring prevailing wage compliance on construction projects at healthcare facilities.

As contractors who live and work in Rhode Island, we take pride in delivering high-quality projects that serve our communities. Healthcare facilities are among the most complex and critical projects we build, requiring skilled labor, strong safety standards, and reliable project execution. Prevailing wage policies help ensure that these standards are consistently met.

For these reasons, we respectfully urge you to support this legislation. It will strengthen Rhode Island's construction industry, improve project outcomes, and ensure that our healthcare facilities are built to the highest standards for the communities they serve.
