My name is Ava Bradley, and I am writing to express my **strong support for the two bills H7891 & H7989**. Together, these two bills establish and protect rent control in Providence and other cities and towns in Rhode Island.

Multiple national and local news reports have already highlighted the shocking fact that Providence has the fastest inflating rent prices in the country. This is obviously a *crisis* that continues to enact major consequences on all aspects of people's lives, including general welfare, financial agency, and health. It makes little sense that rents continue to rise at incredibly high rates when people's wages nor living conditions do not.

The two bills that we are in support of provide a very concrete solution to Rhode Island's housing crisis.
