RE: H 5803 -- AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY -- STATE BUILDING CODE

Dear Chair Casey:

I write on behalf of the Department of Business Regulation in support of House Bills 5803.

The bill before you today aims to further expand the successful Statewide E-Permitting Initiative currently under the purview of the State Building Office within DBR. We are proud of the successful implementation and expansion of the e-permitting program in recent years, and strongly support efforts to further expand it to related business processes and our partner state agencies. We have achieved near-uniform uptake of e-permitting among building and fire departments across Rhode Island. At present, we are hard at work implementing the expansion to planning and zoning applications in close collaborations with municipalities – zoning applications started to go-live at the beginning of this month with a uniform planning application being developed for deployment later this summer.

House Bill 5803 would facilitate the adoption of uniform e-permitting within DEM, CRMC, and the Department of Transportation; this is a logical and likely beneficial next step for the e-permitting program and one that the Department strongly supports conceptually. We are aware of e-permitting initiatives at our partner agencies, and look forward to further evaluating the path forward towards a unified e-permitting system within state government.
