I am writing in strong support of 2022 House Bill H 7209, An Act Relating to Alcoholic Beverages – Manufacturing and Wholesale Licenses – Retail Licenses.

During my tenure as Chair of the Small Business Advocacy Council, I have received feedback from small business owners across the state. Restaurants and food service in particular have been struggling with the financial hardships and workforce shortages of the COVID-19 pandemic. Rhode Island's economy is dependent on our small business community, and our state must support their recovery in every way possible.

By making permanent the practice of allowing alcohol to be purchased with to-go orders, this bill will go a long way towards strengthening the resiliency of local restaurants and breweries.
