RE: BILL NUMBER H-5451 - RELATING TO PUBLIC RECORDS -- PUBLIC RECORDS ADMINISTRATION

Chair Shanley and Honorable Committee Members,

On behalf of the Rhode Island League of Cities and Towns and our affiliate members, the Rhode Island Town & City Clerks' Association (RITCCA), I am writing to express our strong support for House Bill 5451, which seeks to modernize the Public Records Administration Act by establishing a public records administrator, updating definitions, improving records retention procedures, and enhancing public access to government records.

Transparency, accountability, and efficiency are core tenets of good governance, and this legislation represents a necessary step forward in ensuring that public records are properly maintained, preserved, and accessible for future generations. By clarifying definitions and incorporating electronic record-keeping best practices, House Bill 5451 aligns Rhode Island's public records management with modern standards while protecting historical and governmental documents.

The bill's provisions for a records control schedule, the designation of a records officer, and the mandatory transfer of records to the state archives after twenty years will provide consistency and clarity for municipal clerks and public agencies. Their efforts to enhance transparency and efficiency in government are greatly appreciated.
