I write today in strong support of House Joint Resolution 5515, which proposes a constitutional amendment to modernize Rhode Island's voting requirements. This reform particularly benefits young voters, marginalized communities, and those facing unpredictable life circumstances, thereby fostering a more inclusive democracy.

Maintaining Election Integrity

Concerns about election security are paramount. It's important to note that same-day registration includes measures to verify voter eligibility, ensuring that only qualified individuals can register and vote. States that have implemented same-day registration have maintained the integrity of their elections, demonstrating that accessibility and security can coexist effectively.

Conclusion

By supporting House Joint Resolution 5515, Rhode Island has the opportunity to modernize its electoral system, remove unnecessary barriers to voting, and uphold the democratic principle that every eligible citizen should have their voice heard. I respectfully urge the committee to favorably recommend this resolution and advance it to the full House for consideration.
