Re: 2025 H 5725, An Act Relating to Public Records - Access to Public Records - Cost

Dear Chairman Shanley:

The Administration writes to express its concern with H 5725, An Act Relating to Public Records – Access to Public Records – Cost (Act). The Act would waive fees for records requested under the Access to Public Records Act (APRA) by members of the General Assembly who certify that they are acting in their official capacity and need the records for the discharge of their legislative duties.

Currently, the APRA allows public bodies to charge a minimal fee—\$15/hour—for the processing of requests that exceed one hour. See R.I. Gen. Laws \$38-2-4(b). The ability to impose fees for the search, retrieval, and redaction of documents serves an important function in the APRA process. Levying fees encourages requestors to carefully tailor their requests to precisely the records they seek, which enables public bodies to timely and efficiently produce the requested records. Fees also serve to deter requests that are unreasonably broad, unduly burdensome, or intended to disrupt the public body's business. Additionally, in the general course of business, the Administration provides records to legislative committees and their staff at no cost, when needed to perform their legislative functions.
