**Re: House Bill 7236 – An Act Relating To General Assembly -- The Equity Impact Statement And Budget Equity Impact Act**

Dear Chairperson Shanley,

Thank you for providing the Department of Administration (the "Department") the opportunity to submit our concerns in response to House Bill No. 7236, which establishes a two-year pilot program, from January 2027 to December 2028, to incorporate equity impact statements into the legislative process for both the House and Senate chamber.

The Department appreciates the intent of the legislation but has concerns regarding implementation and availability of agency resources. The Commission on Health Advocacy & Equity (CHAE) is comprised of experts from outside of state government and thus will require a significant amount of coordination with and input from state agencies – particularly the Office of Management and Budget and the Division of Equity, Diversity & Inclusion – in order to draft these equity impact statements. This will overlap with the fiscal note process, requiring the skills of the same analysts in the same timeframe and creating extensive resource constraints.

The Department is also concerned about the requirements surrounding the annual state budget. The Governor's proposed budget is a complex policy document that already goes through a robust analysis process with ample opportunity for stakeholder input. As such, the budget should not be eligible as one of the twenty pieces of proposed legislation for which an equity impact statement may be requested. Should a legislator request an equity impact statement on the budget, it would not be feasible for the CHAE to complete given the subject matter expertise and nuanced data analysis required and lack of resources at the agency level to support such efforts. Further, given the current federal climate, outlining our equity efforts within the state budget may put federal funding at risk as a result of grant certification requirements.
