Re: H 7381 – An Act Relating To Motor And Other Vehicles -- Size, Weight, And Load Limits

Dear Committee Members:

Rhode Island's economy is deeply connected to its coastal and marine industries, as well as construction and infrastructure development. Crane operators provide essential services to construction projects, marinas, shipbuilders, and other businesses across the Rhode Island. However, the current permit structure, which requires repeated single trip permits, creates unnecessary administrative burdens and logistical delays.

Cranes operating on the same approved routes pose no greater infrastructure risk than other permitted heavy trucks when evaluated under the same standards. Aligning the permit system for these vehicles with that of heavy trucks would provide consistency, reduce costs, and improve business operations. It would also be in line with other neighboring states.

Finally, this change would support local businesses, improve transportation efficiency, and help ensure that critical projects involving heavy equipment are completed on time. By allowing for an annual permit, the state can maintain road safety while providing a practical and fair solution for this essential industry.

I urge you to support and advocate for the passage of this bill. Thank you for your consideration of my testimony.
