**RE: H 7349 – An Act Relating to Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities and Hospitals – Oversight of Artificial Intelligence Technology in Mental Health Care Act**

Dear Chair Donovan:

Please accept this letter regarding H 7349, legislation that would establish regulations regarding the use of artificial intelligence in mental healthcare treatments. Although the Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH) applauds the intent of the legislation, please know that RIDOH is currently reviewing this proposal and is seeking input from the Rhode Island Department of Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities and Hospitals (BHDDH), which has the statutory authority over the [\*Rhode Island Mental Health Law\*](#) referenced in the proposed legislation and over behavioral healthcare, including the program areas of integrated mental health services and substance abuse treatment and prevention services ([RIGL 40.1-1-4](#)). As the State's Single State Agency (SSA) for mental health and substance use disorders, BHDDH has authority to oversee mental health and substance use disorder prevention, treatment and recovery services. RIDOH is supportive of the letter submitted by BHDDH to the Committee on the proposed legislation.

RIDOH is also seeking input from the associated RIDOH healthcare professional licensing boards to carefully analyze the impact the proposed legislation would have on licensure and disciplinary processes. It is important to note that, from a regulatory perspective, RIDOH does not license all the healthcare professional types included in H 7349. The bill authorizes RIDOH to promulgate rules and regulations to carry out the intent of the Act, but amends Title 40.1 of the General Laws entitled *Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities, and Hospitals* for which RIDOH has no authority. It is also noted that H 7349 does not include physicians in its definition of "licensed professional" even though physicians provide mental health services.

RIDOH looks forward to working with the Committee, BHDDH, and our professional boards to achieve the goals of the legislation by learning more about this bill's intent and requirements, as well as the potential benefits to both regulated professionals and patients/clients throughout Rhode Island.

Thank you for the opportunity to work to comment on this legislation.
