Re: Testimony in **SUPPORT** of H-7627

Chair Donovan:

We write in **support** of H-7627, an act which would give eligible families the opportunity to extend Early Intervention (EI) services until the September after a child's third birthday, to reduce gaps in services and promote smooth transitions into school-based special education services. Under current law, Rhode Island's EI program ends on a child's third birthday, at which point school districts become responsible for providing special education services to eligible children. This is challenging because schools typically work on school year calendars, and school-based services are not always available immediately when a child turns three, especially if the child has a spring or summer birthday. We often see gaps in services for children transitioning from EI to school-based special education, and these gaps could be avoided if families had the option to extend EI until the start of the next school year.

As a provider of EI services, we appreciate that S-7627 takes a slow and incremental approach to avoid overloading a fragile provider system too quickly. The proposal includes a nearly two-year planning period, during which the implementation team will meet. This gives the State, providers, school districts, and families the time to develop the capacity and new systems necessary to support this new population of EI recipients after their third birthdays.

Thank you very much for your careful consideration of this bill and our testimony.
