

Toward a more robust postsecondary system

- Multiply efforts across public and private institutions
- People without postsecondary credentials are being left behind
- Need to add credentials aligned to job market
- Earning power increases proportionate to education attainment

Recent history: Why postsecondary education is critical



Bachelor's degree or higher Associate's degree or some college

High school or less

Employment of workers with more than a high school education increased by 11.5 million of the 11.6 million net new jobs added in the post

Impact of education on earning potential




POSTSECONDARY ATTAINMENT WORKING-AGE POPULATION AGE 25+

52.9% of Rhode Islanders have attained a postsecondary degree or credential

- 45% have attained postsecondary degrees
- 7.9% have a postsecondary credential







- Reaching new markets
- Expanding to northern RI
- Open during shutdown
- Over 1,000 students served in COVID
- Necessary for attainment
- Partnerships with public & private IHEs, business community, nonprofits & community-based organizations


Dual and concurrent enrollment

Since its start in the academic year of 2015-2016, there has been:

- 41% increase in student participation
- 70% increase¹ in dual enrollment credits
 earned
- 15% increase¹ in concurrent enrollment credits earned

¹ Based on comparison of yearly enrollments since 2016-2017 academic year.

Accelerated college credit program participation has a positive impact on enrolling in college within a year of graduating




Note: The sample size is 3,916 students in a matched sample drawn from students who were first-time 9th graders in Rhode Island public schools in 2013/14. Protect Each Other

Governor's recommended FY 2022 budget

Total Budget \$44.4 M (over 95% is pass-through)

General Revenue \$17.3 M

OPC Operating Budget \$1.7 M

FTEs = 31 OPC - 13

RINEC - 10 (restricted)

WEC - 8 (restricted)

+2 FTEs requested for Northern RI Education Center

A few considerations as you review our budget:

- 1. It was created within prescribed fiscal constraints, due to the pandemic.
- 2. The budget was submitted 6 months prior to the new commissioner's arrival.
- 3. The office is transitioning to a new agenda with focused priorities not reflected in the current budget.
