Challenges

Biotoxin concerns in these waters Federal ordinance's provisions for harvesting in waters where biotoxins are a concern complicated and costly

There is opportunity to support and potentially attract more surf clam industry to Rhode Island

Program requires inspection, monitoring, sampling, and testing for compliance with federal laws & would cost approximately \$374,083 (staff and equipment).
