

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

Original vs. Revised (in thousands)







# Rhode Island & United States Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rates March 2021 – March 2022






### **Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rates**



(108,100 total jobs lost during Pandemic; as of March 2022 92,000 (85.1%) jobs recovered)






