#### **Public Defender**

- Created in 1941 by Chapter 1007 of the Public Laws
  - Office & its functions defined by RIGL12-15
  - ❖ RIGL 14-1 authorizes referral of juvenile cases to the Office
  - ❖ RIGL 40-11 authorizes referral of dependency, neglect and termination of parental rights cases
  - Offices located in five Judicial Complexes
    - ✓ Providence (2), Kent, Washington, and Newport

#### **Public Defender**

- Statutory mandates
  - Legal representation to adults and juveniles without financial resources to obtain private counsel
  - Representation services include
    - ✓ Indigent adult and juvenile criminal felony and misdemeanor offenses
    - ✓ Termination of parental rights and dependency and neglect cases
    - ✓ Appellate representation in the Supreme Court

#### **Public Defender**

- Conflict of Interests
  - When interests of a client is adverse to that of another client
  - Client(s) can be referred to the Judicial Indigents Defense program
    - ✓ The Judiciary assigns private attorneys to provide representation services
    - ✓ Each court maintains a list of qualified attorneys

- ➤ Governor recommends \$9.9 million from all funds for 93.0 full-time positions for FY 2014
  - FTEs consistent with enacted and request
- Governor includes \$9.7 million for FY 2013 Revised
  - As of February 25, the Office has 91.0 filled positions
  - \*FY 2012 averaged 90.0 filled positions

- ➤ Governor includes \$9.8 million from general revenues for salaries and benefits for FY 2014
  - ❖ \$0.2 million more than enacted, \$0.1 million less than requested
    - ✓\$36,579 from additional turnover savings
    - ✓\$61,867 from statewide benefit savings
- Governor recommends \$9.6 million from general revenues for FY 2013
  - √ \$62,501 less than enacted from statewide benefit savings.

### General Revenue Target Reduction

- Office proposed 9.0 fewer positions for FY 2014 to meet the Budget Office target
  - \*\$0.8 million general revenue reduction
    - ✓ The Office believes it would hinder ability to absorb additional cases
  - This proposal was not recommended by the Governor

#### Federal Funds

- ➤ Governor includes \$0.1 million from federal funds for salaries and benefits for FY 2013 and 2014
  - \$0.1 million less than enacted, consistent with Office's request
    - ✓ Expiration of federal grants
    - ✓ Community Partnership/Outreach program

### Other Operations

- Governor recommends \$1.4 million from all funds for all other operating expenses
  - \*\$1.2 million from general revenues, \$0.2 million from federal funds
    - ✓ Rent and parking expenses
    - ✓ Upgrade Office software operating system
    - ✓ Court overhead charges for office space and utilities
  - ◆ \$0.1 million more than enacted from all funds
    - ✓\$47,930 for Intake Interviewers
    - √\$35,000 for Case management services

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
