## **Operating Budget Request**

- Office originally submitted operating request in October 2014
- Revisions submitted in February 2015
  - Reflect new Secretary of State's priorities
- Governor's recommendation reflects many of the proposals included in the revisions

## **Target Budget**

- Budget Office provided general revenue target of \$6.4 million
  - Current service adjustments of \$0.4 million
  - 7.5% reduction of \$0.5 million
  - Office's original request \$8,597 below target
- Governor recommends \$0.5 million above target

## Personnel

- FY 2015 Revised \$5.3 million
  - \$0.2 million less than enacted
  - Additional transitional turnover, statewide medical benefit savings and other adjustments
- FY 2016 \$5.7 million
  - \$0.3 million more than enacted
  - Fully funds anticipated staffing costs

## Secretary of State's and Board of Elections' Role in Elections

- Secretary of State's Elections & Civics
   Division and Board of Elections are
   charged with different responsibilities
  - Complementary tasks, many of which are mandated by Rhode Island General Laws

## Secretary of State's and Board of Elections' Role in Elections

#### Secretary of State

- Provides municipalities
- Certifies federal and state candidates for ballot placement
- Prepares state and local referenda
- Describes and explains state referenda in Voter Handbook

#### **Board of Elections**

- Supervises all elections
- with forms for candidates Instructs and certifies all election officials assigned to polls
  - Trains poll workers
  - Prepares and distributes poll worker guides and related materials

### Secretary of State's and Board of Elections' Role in Elections

#### **Secretary of State**

- Publishes guides for candidates, election officials, and voters
- Provides ballot information and polling place locations • on website
- Prepares and prints ballots
- Maintains central voter registration system

#### **Board of Elections**

- Prepares and delivers voting machines and supplies to polling places
- Conducts recounts
- Certifies election results to Secretary of State
- Conducts voter registration drives

### **Voter Rolls**

- Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC)
  - Formed in 2012 with assistance from Pew
  - Provides members states with info. on:
    - Voters who have moved in state or out of state
    - Voters who have passed away
    - Duplicate registrations
    - Potential voters eligible but not yet registered

## **Voter Rolls**

- ERIC's membership: 11 states and DC
  - Current membership does not include Florida or the other 10 most populous states
- Governor recommends requested funding:
  - FY 2015: \$35,000 for one-time membership fee and pro-rated annual dues to ERIC
  - FY 2016: \$100,000 for annual dues, and mailings to eligible voters not yet registered and voters moved out of state

## **Election Expenses**

- FY 2015 Revised \$1.4 million
  - \$0.1 million more than enacted, \$2,579 less than requested
    - On-year expenses including referenda costs
- FY 2016 \$0.3 million
  - \$0.9 million less than enacted, \$7,235 more than requested
    - Off-year expenses including printing costs

## **State Archives**

- Comprehensive archives and records management services for all public records of the State
- Local government records program
  - Provides advisory and technical services to municipal governments for public records
- Historical Records Trust Fund receipts
  - Fees collected by cities and towns for various land transactions and for probate filings

## **State Archives**

- Governor recommends \$0.7 million from all funds in both years
  - \$0.1 million more than requested
- General revenues of \$155,076 for FY 2015 and \$69,266 for FY 2016
  - Reflects there are not enough restricted receipts to cover budgeted expenses

## Information Technology

- Governor recommends funding for:
  - Lobby Tracker Module consistent with enacted budget and Office's request
    - \$24,000 each in FY 2015 and FY 2016
  - Improvements to eGov/Information Technology Division consistent with Office's request
  - Maintenance & repairs of computer equipment

## Information Technology

- State Agency Rules & Regs. project
  - \$100,000 included in enacted budget, but not recommended
  - Office does not plan to move forward with project
  - In-house project instead in eGov/Information Technology Division

# State House Visitor's Center and Gift Shop

- Opened in December 2013
- Staffed by Rhode Island senior citizens
- 2012 law created a restricted receipt account
  - Funded by merchandise sales
  - Receipts used to replenish merchandise
- Governor recommends \$15,000 for both FY 2015 and FY 2016
  - Consistent with enacted budget and request

## Rhode Island Charter Encasement

- Enacted budget includes \$0.5 million for charter encasement in FY 2015
  - Replace encasement and HVAC & cooling systems protecting the charter
- Governor recommends RICAP funds of \$63,754 for FY 2015 and \$436,246 for FY 2016
  - Revised project schedule
  - Governor adds \$23,000 from gen. rev. to insure charter during transport
