 - Provides classroom training to URI

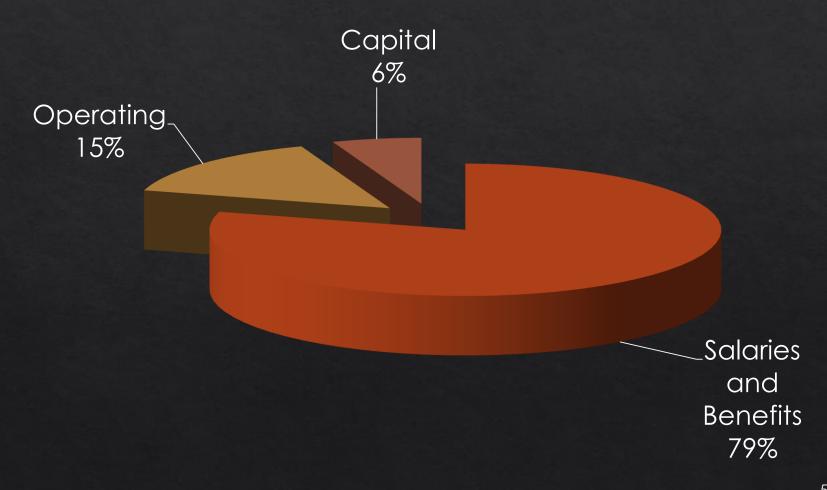

Salaries and Benefits

- ♦ FY 2016: \$1.0 million
 - \$83,241 less than enacted, \$74,565 less from general revenues
 - Turnover savings from hiring two FTEs at lower salaries
 - Additional statewide medical benefit savings
- ♦ FY 2017: \$1.1 million
 - \$33,510 less than enacted, \$29,386 less from general revenues
 - Fully funds 8.6 full-time positions
 - Turnover savings from hiring two FTEs at lower salaries

Federal Funds

- Federal funds are used for research and instrumentation upgrades
- ♦ FY 2016 Revised: \$325,555
 - ♦\$279,270 more than enacted
 - Commission had originally intended to upgrade instruments in FY 2015 but was unable to complete process with State Purchasing
- ♦ FY 2017: \$50,308

Other Operations

- ♦FY 2016: \$177,096
 - \$\$50,375 more than enacted, \$53,845 from general revenues
 - Turnover savings shifted to operating expenditures
- ♦FY 2017: \$178,388
 - \$\$1,667 more than enacted, \$53,316 from general revenues
 - Average of FY 2014 and FY 2015 spending
- Funds are used for building maintenance, utilities, machinery upkeep, general office expenses

Capital Projects

- The Governor includes \$78,931 for asset protection projects for FY 2016
- \$50,000 per year FY 2017 through FY 2021
- Office renovations, sewer system redesign and replacement, landscaping improvements, other exterior renovations

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
