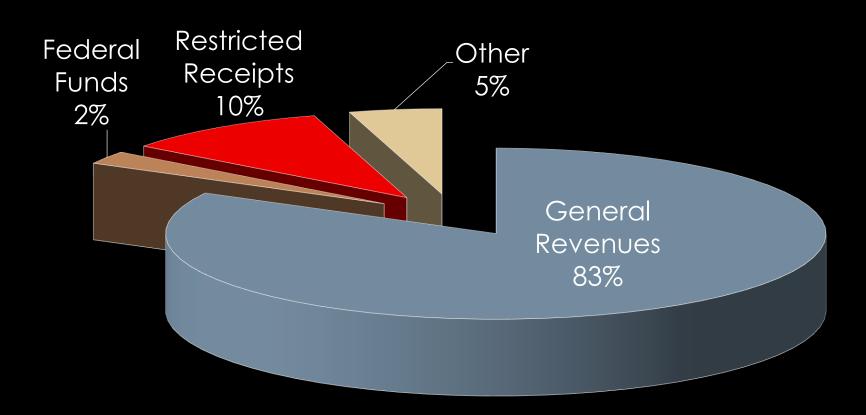

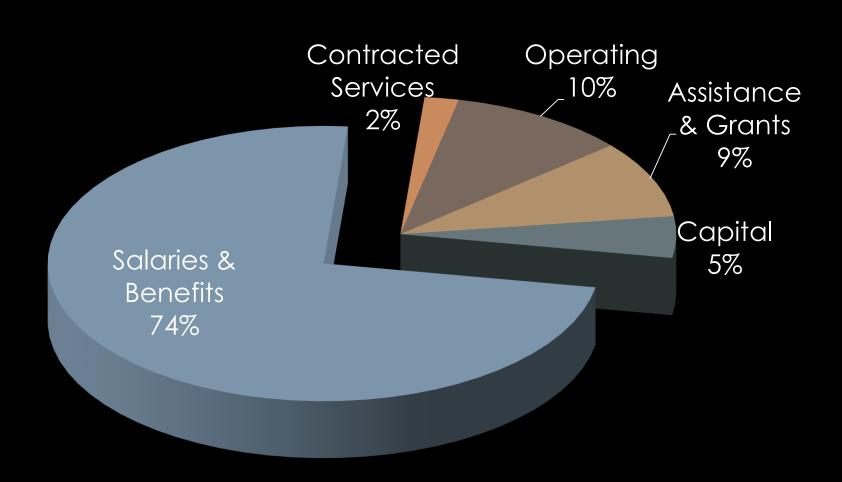

#### Statewide Savings Initiatives

- Governor distributes statewide general revenue savings enacted for FY 2019 in the Department of Administration
  - Prompt Payment \$0.4 million
    - Vendors voluntarily offer a discount if payments are received within an agreed upon date
  - Contracts \$3.0 million
    - Effort to reduce costs of certain commodities
      - Food, maintenance, office equipment, telecommunications
  - Insurance \$0.5 million
    - Reductions in policies for property & crime

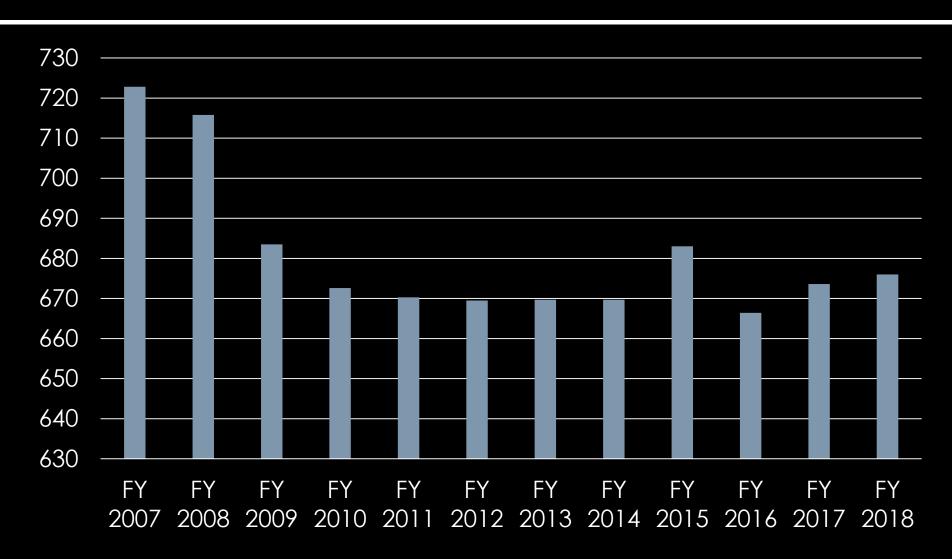

#### Target Budget

- Budget Office provided a general revenue target of \$100.4 million
  - Current service adjustments of \$3.2 million
  - 5% target reduction of \$4.8 million
    - Adjusted for certain exclusions
- Judiciary did not submit a constrained budget request
- Governor's budget is \$0.9 million above current services

# Vacant Judge & Magistrate Positions By Court

- Governor announced appointment to fill 6 vacancies on Dec 10
  - FY 2019 revised budget includes \$0.5 million to fund them for 4<sup>th</sup> quarter
  - FY 2020 budget includes \$2.0 million
- 6 other vacancies currently

#### FY 2019 Revised Revisions

- \$1.9 million of unspent general revenues from FY 2018 reappropriated to FY 2019
  - Current law requirement
- Judiciary requested ~ ½ or \$1.0 million
- Governor recommended \$0.9 million less than requested
  - Statewide savings

#### Pay-Go Pensions

- \$5.7 million for FY 2020
  - \$2,544 more than enacted
- For judges & magistrates hired before 1990
  - Not part of Employees' Retirement System
  - Paid through annual appropriation rather than through the retirement trust fund
- 6 judges still working that are not part of the pension system
  - All are eligible to retire

#### Case Management System

- Electronic filing for all courts
  - Computers, servers, software
  - Increased efficiency for data management
- \$0.5 million for FY 2020
  - Mostly from restricted receipts
  - \$0.1 million more than enacted
  - To create an automated payment plan through the portal to enhance collections

#### **Court Technology**

- Unrelated to case management system
  - Computers
  - Copier and scanner replacement
  - Contract work for reporting, network support, & applications support
- \$3.0 million for FY 2020

#### Security

- \$0.8 million for FY 2020
  - \$0.5 million more than enacted
  - Related to increase in gang violence in and around Providence courthouses
- Reimbursements to Capitol Police,
   Sheriffs, State Police & Providence Police
- Brinks & Dunbar Armored Car Service
  - Cash and check deposit pickups
- Parking area security for judges

#### Facilities and Operations

- \$6.1 million for FY 2020
  - \$0.3 million more than enacted
  - Custodial and maintenance
  - Minor renovations and repairs

#### Indigent Defense

- Court appoints legal representation when Public Defender has a conflict of interest
- \$4.1 million for FY 2020
  - \$0.4 million more than enacted
  - \$0.4 million less than FY 2019
- \$4.5 million for FY 2019

#### Interpreters & Translators

- Federal requirements for language access
  - Unfunded mandate
- \$0.3 million for FY 2020
  - Consistent with FY 2019 enacted budget
  - Mostly from general revenues
- Services provided in 32 languages according to a recent annual report

#### Overhead Functions - Legal

- \$3.9 million for FY 2020 and 24 FTE
  - \$0.1 million more than enacted
    - Anticipated staffing costs
    - Statewide benefit adjustments
  - Law Library
  - Board of Bar Examiners
  - Mandatory Continuing Legal Education
  - Appellate Screening Unit
  - Disciplinary Board/Counsel

#### Other Overhead Functions

- \$6.6 million for FY 2020
  - Finance, Budget, & Employee Relations
  - Planning
  - Judicial Records Center
- \$0.1 million less than enacted
  - Anticipated staffing costs
  - Statewide benefit adjustments
  - Statewide operating savings

# Individual Courts FY 2020 Recommendation

#### Supreme Court

- Final court of review
  - Only constitutionally established court
- 5 Judges, 164.7 total positions
  - Most associated with some degree of overhead
- \$18.3 million for FY 2020
  - \$1.7 million more than enacted
    - Almost all for salaries and benefits
      - Restores enacted turnover savings
      - Current service adjustments
      - Statewide benefit savings

# RI Coalition Against Domestic Violence

- \$230,000 from general revenues for FY 2019 and FY 2020
  - Funding for the Coalition to administer
     Domestic Abuse Court Advocacy Project
    - Project established in RIGL 12-29-7
  - Consistent with enacted budget

#### RI Legal Services

- \$90,000 from general revenues for FY 2019 and FY 2020
  - Funding for RI Legal Services to provide housing and eviction defense to indigent individuals
  - Consistent with enacted budget

#### Superior Court

- Jurisdiction over felony & misdemeanor cases appealed or waived from District Court
  - Small claims
  - Violations of municipal ordinances & regs.
  - Misdemeanors when right to jury trial waived
- 27 Judges/Magistrates, 164.7 total FTE
- \$25.5 million for FY 2020
  - \$1.1 million more than enacted

#### **Superior Court**

- Judicial Appointments \$0.5 million
  - 2 associate judges
- Diversion Program \$50,000
  - Additional risk assessments for defendants who score as high risk
    - New requirement from 2017 law
    - Justice Reinvestment initiative

#### District Court

- 16 Judges/Magistrates,95.0 total FTE
- \$14.0 million for FY 2020
  - Small claims
  - Violations of municipal ordinances & regs.
  - Misdemeanors when right to jury trial waived
- \$0.1 million less than enacted
  - Turnover savings

#### **District Court**

- Veterans' Court
- \$0.1 million and 4 FTE
  - Specialized calendar is a jail diversion program aimed at addressing veterans charged primarily with misdemeanor offenses
  - Created in April of 2011
  - 2015 Assembly established calendar in statute

#### Family Court

- Cases involving
  - Juveniles
  - Parental neglect, Paternity issues & Divorces
- 21 Judges/Magistrates, 171.7 total FTE
- \$25.9 million for FY 2020
  - \$1.6 million more than enacted
    - \$0.5 million for judicial appointments
    - \$0.8 million for other salaries and benefits
      - Restored turnover savings
      - Statewide benefit adjustments
      - Current service adjustments

#### **Traffic Tribunal**

- Civil traffic violations
  - License suspensions
  - DOT and DEM violations
- 8 Judges/Magistrates, 76.2 total FTE
- \$9.3 million for FY 2020
  - \$0.4 million less than enacted
    - \$0.3 million more for judicial appointments
    - \$0.7 million less for other salaries and benefits
      - Turnover and statewide benefit savings

#### Workers' Compensation Court

- Adjudicates all workers' compensation cases
  - Including rehabilitation of injured employees
- 10 Judges, 50.0 total positions
- \$8.9 million from restricted receipts for FY 2020
  - \$0.5 million more than enacted
    - \$0.3 million for current service adjustments
    - \$0.2 million to restore turnover savings
    - Statewide benefit savings not taken

#### Judicial Tenure and Discipline

- Judicial Tenure and Discipline Commission
  - Conducts investigations of judges suspected or charged with misconduct
- 14 member commission serves without compensation
- \$0.2 million funding for 1.0 position and operations

    - 5 years beyond useful life
  - Energy savings are expected from better efficient units

- Garrahy Interior Restoration Excluding Courtrooms
  - Removing and replacing floors and carpets
  - Sealing and repainting walls
  - Woodwork refinishing
  - Refurbishing employee bathrooms
- McGrath Replacement of Rooftop Units
  - Replace all 18 units

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
