Subject: Amendments to FY 2010 Supplemental Appropriations Act (10-H-7105)

The Governor requests several amendments to the FY 2010 Supplemental Appropriations Act, which was submitted to the General Assembly on December 15, 2009.

The amendments to appropriations in Article 1 requested are described below.

ARTICLE 1, RELATING TO MAKING REVISED APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2010

SECTION 1, REVISED APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2010

Department of Administration

Increase Federal Funds in Planning, page 4, line 23, in the amount of \$60,000.

This amendment increases the budget for Emergency Shelter Grants program. The Office of Housing and Community Development has identified additional federal funds that can be allocated to the program.

Decrease 'RICAP - Adolph Meyer Renovations', page 6, line 18, in the amount of \$100,000. The FY 2010 Supplemental Appropriations Act included the funding for this new capital project under the Department of Administration; however, the

Capital Budget document displayed the project under the Department of Children, Youth, and Families. Although the Division of Capital Projects and Property Management within Administration will be responsible for overseeing this project, it is the policy of the Budget Office to budget capital projects under the agency most directly benefitting from the project. As such, the Capital Budget document properly reflected this project under DCYF, but the Appropriations Act and accompanying database were not corrected to match. This amendment requests that funding be moved to the DCYF budget.

Department of Labor and Training

Increase Federal Funds in the Workforce Development Services Program, page 9, line 10 by \$539,755: This reflects an agreement between the Department of Human Services and the Department of Labor and Training to implement a stimulus initiative that utilizes TANF emergency funds for 19.0 limited term FTE positions to assist in the implementation of a new subsidized employment program.

Increase Federal Funds in the Income Support Program, page 9, line 18 by \$1,258,860: This reflects 26.4 FTE positions to assist with new and continued claims processing with funding from increased contingency base formula funding.

Department of Revenue

Insert line for Federal Funds Stimulus in Taxation Program, page 10, after line 18 in the amount of \$16,258: This reflects an agreement between the Department of Human Services and the Department of Revenue to implement a stimulus initiative that utilizes TANF emergency funds for 1.0 limited term FTE position to assist in the implementation of a new subsidized employment program.

Department of Children, Youth, and Families

Insert line for ‘RICAP - Adolph Meyer Renovations’, page 14, after line 27, in the amount of \$100,000. The FY 2010 Supplemental Appropriations Act included the funding for this new capital project under the Department of Administration; however, the Capital Budget document displayed the project under the Department of Children, Youth, and Families. Although the Division of Capital Projects and Property Management within Administration will be responsible for overseeing this project, it is the policy of the Budget Office to budget capital projects under the agency most directly benefitting from the project. As such, the Capital Budget document properly reflected this project under DCYF, but the Appropriations Act and accompanying database were not corrected to match. This amendment requests that funding be moved to the DCYF budget.

Department of Health

Insert “Safe and Active Commuting” after “Walkable Communities Initiative”, page 16, line 8 in the amount of \$56,749. This amount reflects new federal

funding via the RI Department of Transportation for a new cooperative agreement to promote safe and active commuting under federal authorization of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, and Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU).

Department of Human Services

Increase Federal Funds- Stimulus in the Individual and Family Support program, page 16, line 34 by \$18,079,064: This increase represents financing for a new State program of subsidized employment financed through the “Emergency Contingency Fund for State Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Programs”. This fund was established by the American Recovery and Investment Act (Division B, Title II, Subtitle B) to assist states experiencing caseload or expenditure increases within certain categories of TANF-eligible public assistance expenditures, including subsidized employment. Rhode Island’s allocation from the Emergency Contingency Fund totals approximately \$47.0 million, or half of the State’s annual TANF block grant. To leverage this federal financing, the Governor proposes creation of a temporary program of subsidized employment, commencing in early Spring 2010 and continuing, at a minimum, through September 30, 2010.

Administered by the Departments of Human Services, Labor and Training, Revenue, and the Workforce Investment Boards, this program will seek to place individuals from TANF-eligible families in gainful employment with participating private (and possibly public) employers throughout the State. Emergency TANF funds will be utilized to provide a wage subsidy to these employers, who must consent to a non-displacement agreement with respect to current employees. Anticipated program financing in FY 2010 totals \$18.6 million across all Departments, the bulk of which (\$18,079,064) is housed within DHS for two distinct purposes: (1) \$18,006,100 for the disbursement of subsidized wages to participating employers for the final two months of the fiscal year and (2) \$72,964 to finance 4.0 FTE to support eligibility determination during the final quarter of FY 2010.

Increase Federal Funds in the Health Care Quality, Financing and Purchasing program, page 17, line 17 by \$88,384: This increase reflects the planned disbursement of residual funding available under the Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) program in FY 2010.

Decrease Pharmacy General Revenues in the Medical Benefits Program, page 17, line 29 by \$18,011,317: This decrease represents the general revenue savings associated with the application of the ARRA-enhanced FMAP to the phased-down State contribution for Medicare Part D (i.e. the “clawback” payment). Specifically, general revenue clawback expenditures are anticipated to decrease

from \$44.0 million to \$26.0 million in FY 2010. Previously, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' (CMS) guidance indicated that the ARRA enhancement was inapplicable to the clawback payment. However, a recent policy reversal by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) allows for monthly clawback payments to be calculated using the enhanced FMAP, retroactive to October 2008. Due to this retroactivity, CMS plans to issue a credit to States for previously remitted overpayments that were charged at the base FMAP from October 2008 through January 2010. For Rhode Island, this credit is anticipated to total \$13.6 million, and will be applied (until exhausted) to all future clawback charges beginning with the February 2010 billing notice. Since remaining FY 2010 clawback payments are estimated at \$14.2 million, the Department will not exhaust the credit until the June 2010 CMS billing, for which approximately \$0.6 million will be remitted by the State, reflecting the (anticipated) balance of the June 2010 monthly charge and the remainder of the retroactive credit.

Mental Health, Retardation and Hospitals

Rename RICAP-Eleanor Slater HVAC line item to RICAP-MHRH Administrative Upgrades, page 30, line 7: The \$555,000 supplemental budget amount is for repairs HVAC repairs and environmental deficiencies in the Simpson Hall and Barry Hall buildings on the Pastore Campus. The project was incorrectly labeled in the appropriation act because the project identifier used in the Capital Budget database was previously used for the Eleanor Slater HVAC/Elevator project.

Department of Elementary and Secondary Education

Increase Federal Funds in the Administration of the Comprehensive Education Strategy Program, page 21, line 10 by \$235,912: This reflects increases for eleven federal grants based upon available funding under these grants and anticipated FY 2010 expenditures.

Public Higher Education

Increase Federal Funds in the Board of Governors/Office of Higher Education Program, page 23, line 4 by \$200,000: This reflects a new federal grant through the RI Department of Education (RIDE) for statewide data system initiatives being developed in conjunction with RIDE.

Military Staff

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan funding, Woonsocket Building Demolition, page 29, line 32, by \$46,540. Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan funding, Asset Protection, page 29, line 29 by \$46,540. This reflects the transfer of surplus funds from the Woonsocket Building Demolition project to the Asset Protection project account to match available federal funds. Funding will be used to repave the Command Readiness Center parking lot.

Department of Public Safety

Increase Federal Funds – Stimulus in the Central Management Program, page 30, line 12 by \$1,203,075: After further discussion with local police departments, the department determined that some Stimulus – Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Grant funding originally scheduled for release in FY 2011 would best be utilized in FY 2010. This increase reflects the estimated expenditures to local police departments in FY 2010 and results in a shift of funding from the proposed FY 2011 budget to FY 2010. An offsetting reduction to the FY 2011 recommended budget will also be submitted.

Increase Federal Funds in the State Fire Marshal Program, page 30, line 25 by \$50,000: This reflects a new award received by the department for a Hazardous Materials Emergency Program.

Department of Environmental Management

Increase Federal Funds in the Environmental Protection Program, page 32, line 22 by \$180,000: This reflects an increase in the federal award for the RI Brownsfields - Sub C grant received by the department.

Coastal Resources Management Council

Decrease Federal Funds, page 33, line 3 by a net of \$14,513. This reflects technical adjustments in the Coastal Resources Management Project and the Aquaculture Research federal line items to align them with actual awards.

SECTION 4, FTE POSITION AUTHORIZTION

Department of Labor and Training

Increase FTE Position Authorization, section 4, page 36, line 19 by 45.4 FTE: This increases the recommended FTE position authorization from 475.1 to 520.5. Funding increases are available from base contingency funds and TANF emergency funds from DHS stimulus funding.

Department of Revenue

Increase FTE Position Authorization, section 4, page 36, line 20 by 1.0 FTE: This increases the recommended FTE position authorization from 428.0 to 429.0. Funding for this increase is available from TANF emergency funds to support a position to oversee the payment of funds to employers under the subsidized employment program

Department of Human Services

Increase FTE Position Authorization, section 4, page 37, line 1 by 4.0 FTE: This increases the recommended FTE positions from 954.6 to 958.6. Funding for these FTE is available from the Emergency Contingency Fund for TANF,

pursuant to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. These positions will provide administrative support for the subsidized employment program.
