Subject: Amendments to FY 2010 Supplemental Appropriations Act (10-H-7105)

The Governor requests several amendments to the FY 2010 Supplemental Appropriations Act, which was submitted to the General Assembly on December 15, 2009.

The amendments to appropriations in Article 1 requested are described below.

ARTICLE 1, RELATING TO MAKING REVISED APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2010

SECTION 1, REVISED APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2010

Department of Administration

Decrease Facilities Management General Revenues, page 3, line 33 by \$822,500,
Federal Funds, page 3, line 34 by \$29,500, Restricted Receipts, page 4, line 1 by
\$13,100, and Other Funds, page 4, line 2 by \$134,900. Due to lower than expected NYMEX rates for natural gas for the first eight months of the fiscal year, there is a forecasted all funds savings of \$1.0 million in addition to savings recognized in the revised budget submittal. It should be noted that similar savings are not currently forecast for FY 2011, as natural gas prices have been rising in recent weeks.

Increase Federal Funds in Planning, page 4, line 23 by \$1,077,896. This amendment is due to increases in federal grant expenditures for the Community Development Block Grant program, including the FY 2004 award in the amount of \$77,896 and the FY 2008 award in the amount of \$1.0 million.

Increase General Revenues for Torts – Courts, page 5, line 14 by \$400,000. Year-to-date expenditures for tort settlements already exceed \$520,000 or \$120,000 over the enacted budget of \$400,000 and, according to the Attorney General's Office, pending litigation will likely result in additional expenses of several hundred thousand dollars.

Increase General Revenues in Debt Service, page 6, line 23 by \$400,000. The original supplemental budget assumed approximately \$1.37 million of interest earnings on the \$350.0 million in Tax Anticipation Notes (TANS) issued for FY 2010, which would be available to offset the interest expense on this debt. Actual interest earnings through March total approximately \$875,000, about \$500,000 less than projected. Based on recent earnings, no more than an additional \$100,000 can be expected in interest earnings for the balance of the fiscal year. Thus an increase in general revenue funding is required to assure sufficient funds are available to cover the final debt service payment due on June 30, 2010. The interest earnings are kept in a restricted receipt account to offset debt service and any shortfall needs to be covered by general revenues.

Increase Restricted Receipts in Debt Service, page 6, line 25 by \$3,140,845. This adjustment reflects the projected interest earnings on Tax Anticipation Notes (TANS), which was not included in the original supplemental budget.

Increase Federal Funds in Energy Resources, page 7, line 1 by \$2,350,970. This amendment is due to increased expenditures in the federal FY 2010 LIHEAP main award of \$1.5 million and the FY 2009 LIHEAP award of \$850,970, comprised of \$669,742 for increased Weatherization grant expenditures and \$181,228 for the Leveraging account.

Department of Labor and Training

Increase Federal Funds –Stimulus in Workforce Development Services, page 9, line 10 by \$103,611: This reflects additional operating costs and computer purchases for the additional DLT/DHS TANF Jobs Now program. Funding increases from \$539,755 to \$643,366.

Insert a new Other Funds line in the Workforce Development Services Program, page 9, after line 11 for \$100,000: This reflects \$100,000 of management consultant services to fund a Shared Youth Vision Program.

Increase Federal Funds – Stimulus – UI in the Income Support Program, page 9, line 20 by \$27,843,000: This reflects the most recent revised estimates for extended benefits from \$263.6 million to \$291.4 million.

Increase Other Funds Employment Security Fund in the Income Support Program, page 9, line 24 by \$48,200,000: This reflects the most recent revised estimates from the employment security fund for benefits from \$523.8 million to \$572.0 million.

Department of Revenue

Increase Restricted Receipts in Registry of Motor Vehicles, page 10, line 28 by \$4,350,000. As a result of a change in the Registry System financing legislation in the 2009 session, funding collected from the \$1.50 transaction surcharge may be used to fund project expenses, in addition to debt service costs. A portion of those receipts collected to date will be used to directly fund project costs, and will result in a reduction in the total debt issued from \$13.0 million to \$11.25 million. The surcharge receipts have been deposited into a restricted receipt account within the Department of Administration since inception, because all debt service expenditures are funded in the DOA budget. A new restricted receipt account has been established under the Department of Revenue to reflect the project related costs to be funded from surcharge revenues. The budget for this new account, however, was not included in the original supplemental budget.

Department of Children, Youth, and Families

Decrease General Revenues in Juvenile Correctional Services, page 14, line 9 by \$22,660. The Howard's Teachers Union negotiated a contract settlement with the State of Rhode Island, which results in savings from four pay reduction days in FY 2010 and eight pay reduction days, plus the COLA deferral in FY 2011. This decrease reflects savings associated with four pay reduction days because these savings were not assumed in the original supplemental budget because no contract had been signed.

Increase Federal Funds in Juvenile Correctional Services, page 14, line 10 by \$29,750. This increase reflects an additional federal award for the Substance Abuse Block Grant.

Department of Health

Reclassify \$607,500 of Health Laboratories – General Revenues recommended appropriation of \$7,100,740 from the expenditure category of contract professional services to “other financing uses”, page 15, line 29. This zero sum technical amendment recognizes general revenue appropriations for the State Crime Laboratory as a transfer or “other financing uses” to the University of Rhode Island, as opposed to a contract services cost.

Department of Elementary and Secondary Education

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds in State-owned Chariho Repairs Program, page 21, line 21 by \$1,280,747. Insert lines on page 21, after line 21, for “State-owned Cranston Repairs” in the amount of \$389,051, for “State-owned East Providence

Repairs" in the amount of \$157,872, for "State-owned Warwick Repairs" in the amount of \$258,036, and for "State-owned Woonsocket Repairs" in the amount of \$475,788. Funding for all of the state-owned career and technical schools was included in the Chariho line by mistake. This distributes it to the correct communities. There is no net change.

Increase Federal Funds – Stimulus in the School for the Deaf Program, page 22, line 5 by \$37,965. Funding for three stimulus grants was inadvertently omitted in the original supplemental budget. These are Title I, IDEA, and IDEA preschool grants.

Decrease General Revenue in the Davies Career and Technical School program, page 21, line 26 by \$4,074. Decrease General Revenue in the RI School for the Deaf program, page 22, line 3 by \$1,856. Decrease General Revenue in the Metropolitan Career and Technical School program, page 22, line 9 by \$3,241. Decrease General Revenue in the Education Aid program, page 22, line 17 by \$370,808. Decrease General Revenue in the Central Falls School District program, page 22, line 22 by \$22,621.: The combined decrease totaling \$402,600 reflects a shift in OERR administrative costs from the Education Stabilization Fund to the General Government Stabilization Fund. (See related item below in the Department of Public Safety). The money budgeted for the administrative costs is being distributed to LEAs and is being offset by an equal reduction in General Revenue funding. These changes will also be reflected in an amended version of Article 9.

This change is necessitated by a ruling by the federal government regarding the assessment of the 0.5% ARRA administrative charge on Stabilization Funds. Although the assessment is permitted on the full stabilization funding, including both Education and General Government, the federal requirement is that none of the assessment be taken directly from the Education share of stabilization funding, but instead be allocated entirely to the General Government share. The supplemental budget included a set aside of \$402,600 in the Education Stabilization accounts to cover the 0.5% assessment in FY 2010. Since these funds cannot be taken out of these accounts, this amendment requests to reduce general revenue funding by this amount. The funding already budgeted in the federal accounts will now be available for disbursement to LEA's, thus there will be no change in total aid distributed. An offsetting increase in general revenue funding is requested within the Department of Public Safety (State Police) because the administrative assessment related to the Education Stabilization funds will now be taken out of the remaining General Government Stabilization funds, which are budgeted within DPS. Since the purpose of these funds in the DPS budget was to directly offset general revenue expenditures, charging the administrative assessment to this account will reduce the amount available to offset these expenses and thus would leave DPS short of the required funding if general revenue appropriations are not increased.

Rhode Island Higher Education Assistance Authority

Increase Federal Funds in the loans subprogram, page 26, line 10 by \$330,000: This reflects a federal grant for the College Access Challenge Grants.

Rhode Island Historical Preservation and Heritage Commission

Increase Restricted Receipts, page 26, line 20 by \$2,180: The increase reflects a cap increase to account for higher than expected receipts.

Department of Corrections

Decrease General Revenue, page 27, line 28, by \$7,120. Increase Federal Funds, page 27, line 29, by \$7,120. The federal funds increase reflects the carry forward of funds in the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP). The general revenue decrease reflects the transfer of additional personnel costs from the Intake Service Center line item to the SCAAAP federal grant.

Military Staff

Increase Federal Funds – Emergency Management, page 30, line 3 by \$356,519: The increase reflects additional expenditures to be funded from unspent FY 2009 allocations that were not included in the Governor's original recommended Supplemental Budget.

Public Safety

Increase Federal Funds – Stimulus in the Central Management Program, page 30, line 12 by \$222,157: After further discussion with recipient agencies, the department has determined that some Stimulus – Violence Against Women Grant funding originally scheduled for release in FY 2011 would best be utilized in FY 2010. This increase reflects the estimated expenditures to the local agencies in FY 2010 and results in a shift of funding from the proposed FY 2011 budget to FY 2010. An offsetting reduction to the FY 2011 recommended budget will also be submitted.

Increase Federal Funds in the Municipal Police Training Academy Program, page 30, line 33 by \$25,000: The increase reflects additional expenditures of \$25,000 for the DRE/SFST Training grant.

Increase General Revenues in the State Police program, page 31, line 4 by \$402,600: This increase reflects a shift in OERR administrative costs from the Education Stabilization Fund to the General Government Stabilization Fund. (See related item above in the Department of Elementary & Secondary Education).

Department of Environmental Management

Increase Federal Funds in the Natural Resources program, page 32, line 5 by \$85,000: This increase reflects additional expenditures of \$30,000 for the Fish and Wildlife Management Coordination grant and \$55,000 for the Hunter Safety Course grant.

Increase Federal Funds in the Environmental Protection program, page 32, line 22 by \$65,000: This increase reflects additional expenditures of \$65,000 for the Superfund Remediation grant.

Department of Transportation

Increase Federal Funds – Stimulus in the Infrastructure Engineering Program, page 33, line 33 by \$1,278,273: Stimulus funds have been received for the South Country Commuter Rail – Wickford Junction Train Station. Funds will total \$4.4 million from the ARRA Urbanize Area Formula Grant, with \$1,025,000 for FY 2010, and \$3,075,000 for FY 2011. An additional \$253,273 has been received in ARRA funds on an existing program for FY 2010.
