Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Galilee Pier Upgrade, Page 31, Line 34 from by \$550,000 from \$1,250,000 to \$1,800,000. This amendment moves funding from FY 2018 to FY 2019 to provide match for a \$1.6 million federal EDA grant for reconstruction of three commercial piers and bulkheads in Galilee.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Natural Resources Offices/Visitor's Center, Page 32, Line 2 by \$500,000 from \$4,500,000 to \$5,000,000. This amendment moves funding from FY 2018 to FY 2019 due to delays in this project.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Marine Infrastructure and Pier Development, Page 32, Line 3 by \$250,000 from \$750,000 to \$1,000,000. This amendment moves funding from FY 2018 to FY 2019 due to delays in this project.

Insert a new line on Page 32, after Line 4 entitled "Dam Repair" for \$1,900,000. This amendment moves funding from FY 2018 to FY 2019 due to delays in certain dam projects. The department has numerous high hazard dams in various stages of work and this funding will enable these projects to continue uninterrupted pending approval of the environmental ballot question in November, which includes additional funding for dam repairs.

Insert a new line on Page 32, after line 4 entitled "Newport Piers" for \$250,000. This amendment moves \$110,000 from FY 2018 to FY 2019 due to delays in this project and requests an increase of \$140,000 to fully fund remaining projects, which involve repairs to the electrical system at the pier.

## **Coastal Resources Management Council**

<u>Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Narragansett Bay SAMP on Page 32, Line 23 by \$50,000 from \$150,000 to \$200,000</u>. This amendment moves half of the FY 2018 appropriation to FY 2019 due to delays in the contract with the University of Rhode Island to complete the SAMP. The remaining \$50,000 will be moved to FY 2020.

Insert a new line on Page 32, after line 23 entitled "Green Pond Dredging Study" for \$50,000. This amendment moves the funding appropriated in FY 2018 to FY 2019 due to delays in this project.

ARTICLE 10, RELATING TO MAKING REVISED APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2018

SECTION 1, REVISED APPROPRIATIONS IN SUPPORT OF FY 2018

### Department of Administration

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Security Measures State Buildings, Page 240, Line 8 by \$250,000 from \$250,000 to \$500,000. This department has addressed more security projects than anticipated at the time of the supplemental budget and thus this amendment restores funding to the originally enacted level.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Cranston Street Armory, Page 240, Line 10 by \$575,000 from \$500,000 to \$1,075,000. This amendment is based on projected spending on this project due to additional work needed to stabilize the structure.

<u>Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Zambarano Buildings, Page 240, Line 11 by \$700,000 from \$6,085,000 to \$6,785,000.</u> This amendment is based on updated spending projections and additional work needed on several structures on the campus.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Big River Management Area, Page 240, Line 12 by \$75,000 from \$102,307 to \$27,307.</u> This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Veterans Memorial Auditorium, Page 240, Line 13 by \$58,000 from \$205,000 to \$263,000. This amendment is finance existing projects, which had been started in FY 2017 and would have been funded with reappropriated funds, but these were mistakenly withdrawn in the Governor's supplemental budget.

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – RI Convention Center Authority, Page 240, Line 14 by \$865,000 from \$1,000,000 to \$1,865,000. This amendment shifts funding from the Dunkin Donuts Center project based on the work completed this fiscal year.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Dunkin Donuts Center, Page 240, Line 15 by \$865,000 from \$1,500,000 to \$635,000.</u> This amendment shifts funding to the Convention Center project due to fewer projects completed this year at the Dunkin Donuts Center.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Pastore Center Power Plant Rehab, Page 240, Line 16 by \$750,000 from \$800,000 to \$50,000.</u> This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year, partly due to longer lead time needed to replace the steam turbine.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Virks Building Renovations, Page 240, Line 17 by \$1,110,000 from \$6,867,511 to \$5,757,511. This project has been completed for less than estimated and thus the balance can be withdrawn.

<u>Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Accessibility Facility Renovations, Page 240, Line 18 by \$110,000 from \$1,000,000 to \$1,110,000.</u> This amendment increases funding for certain accessibility projects approved by the Commission on Disabilities based on actual costs.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Chapin Health Laboratory, Page 240, Line 20</u> by \$100,000 from \$1,100,000 to \$1,000,000. This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Environmental Compliance, Page 240, Line 21 by \$300,000 from \$400,000 to \$100,000. This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – DoIT Operations Center, Page 240, Line 22 by \$75,000 from \$175,000 to \$100,000.</u> This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Old Colony House, Page 240, Line 23 by \$75,000 from \$100,000 to \$25,000. This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Pastore Center Buildings Demolition, Page 240, Line 25 by \$175,000 from \$175,000 to \$0.</u> No demolition projections are planned for the current fiscal year.

<u>Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Pastore Medical Center Rehab DOA, Page 240, Line 27 by \$2,500,000 from \$5,000,000 to \$7,500,000.</u> This amendment is based on updated spending projections on several projects, including an increase in the scope of asbestos abatement in the Barry/Simpson Hall project; and change orders on the LP and Benjamin Rush window replacement projects.

<u>Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Pastore Center Utilities Upgrade, Page 240, Line 29 by \$50,000 from \$3,377,500 to \$3,427,500.</u> This amendment is based on projected additional spending on this project.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Replacement of Fueling Tanks, Page 240, Line 31 by \$275,000 from \$343,960 to \$68,960.</u> This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – State House Renovations, Page 240, Line 34 by \$400,000 from \$2,287,000 to \$1,887,000.</u> This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year, primarily due to elevator modernization design work taking longer than expected.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – State Office Building, Page 241, Line 1 by \$300,000 from \$1,710,577 to \$1,410,577. This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Washington County Government Center, Page 241, Line 2 by \$250,000 from \$425,000 to \$175,000.</u> This amendment is based on projected lower spending on this project in the current fiscal year.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – William Powers Building, Page 241, Line 3 by \$350,000 from \$1,385,000 to \$1,035,000.</u> This amendment is based on projected lower

spending on this project in the current fiscal year, partly due to a delay in the garage elevator replacement and bathroom renovations.

Rename Page 241, Line 5 from "Mathias Building Upgrades" to "Board of Elections Building (Medical Examiner)". This amendment will correct the title of this project to match the intended use of the requested funding.

Insert a new line on Page 241, after Line 5 entitled "McCoy Stadium" for \$300,000. Although the enacted budget did not include funding for McCoy Stadium, the State continues to have responsibility for certain upkeep and repairs at the facility. This amendment addresses the various projects the Department has undertaken this fiscal year.

### **Executive Office of Commerce**

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – I-195 Redevelopment District Commission, Page 244, Line 10 by \$600,000 from \$446,053 to 1,046,053. This additional funding is for the construction of temporary parking in the I-195 Redevelopment District during the construction of the new parking garage adjacent to the Garrahy Courthouse. Bond counsel on the debt issuance for the parking garage determined that use of bond proceeds would not be permissible for the construction of temporary parking and thus the Governor recommends the use of Rhode Island Capital Plan Fund resources to finance this project.

### Department of Labor and Training

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Center General Asset Protection, Page 245, Line 1 by \$1,000,000 from \$1,630,000 to \$630,000.</u> Although the Department of Labor and Training has been working with the Division of Capital Asset Management and Maintenance to move forward with several projects at the Center General building, as of the end of FY 2018 most projects are only in the design stage. Projects to be completed in the next year are envelop repairs to prevent water infiltration; elevator repairs and window replacements.

### **Secretary of State**

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – State Archives, Page 247, Line 14 by \$3,935 from \$107,546 to \$103,611.</u> This project has been completed with a slight surplus that can be withdrawn.

### **Department of Human Services**

Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Blind Vending Facilities, Page 253, Line 2 by \$73,000 from \$165,000 to \$238,000. This amendment is needed to fully fund current year commitments. The department had projects in process using prior year reappropriated funds, which were mistakenly withdrawn in the Governor's supplemental budget.

Department of Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities and Hospitals

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Community Facilities Fire Code, Page 254,

Line 29 by \$300,000 from \$416,061 to \$116,061. This amendment will bring funding in line with projected spending based on the department's current year plans.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – DD Private Waiver, Page 254, Line 30 by \$100,000 from \$283,299 to \$183,299.</u> This amendment will bring funding in line with projected spending based on the department's current year plans.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Regional Center Repair/Rehab, Page 254, Line 31 by \$300,000 from \$540,275 to \$240,275.</u> This amendment will bring funding in line with projected spending based on the department's current year plans.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – MH Community Facilities Repair, Page 255, Line 10 by \$100,000 from \$200,000 to \$100,000.</u> This amendment will bring funding in line with projected spending based on the department's current year plans.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – MR Community Facilities Repair, Page 255, Line 23 by \$50,000 from \$750,000 to \$700,000. This amendment will bring funding in line with projected spending based on the department's current year plans.

# Department of Elementary and Secondary Education

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Davies School HVAC, Page 256, Line 34 by \$300,000 from \$1,006,155 to \$706,155.</u> Projects at the Davies School have been delayed while a decision on future plans for the school is pending. Proposals to construct a new school or undertake a major rehabilitation of the existing structure may be put forward and further work on the existing structure would not continue until decisions are made.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Davies Asset Protection, Page 257, Line 1 by \$100,000 from \$474,041 to \$374,041. Projects at the Davies School have been delayed while a decision on future plans for the school is pending. Proposals to construct a new school or undertake a major rehabilitation of the existing structure may be put forward and further work on the existing structure would not continue until decisions are made.

### **Atomic Energy Commission**

<u>Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – RINSC Asset Protection, Page 261, Line 28 by \$28,000 from \$50,000 to \$78,000.</u> This amendment is needed to fully fund current year commitments. The agency had projects in process using prior year reappropriated funds, which were mistakenly withdrawn in the Governor's supplemental budget.

### **Department of Corrections**

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Building State Match - Reintegration, Page 263, Line 14 by \$151,133 from \$151,133 to \$0.</u> No expenditures on this facility are planned for this fiscal year.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – ISC Exterior Envelope and HVAC, Page 263, Line 15 by \$1,300,000 from \$2,027,455 to \$727,455.</u> This project has experienced some delays and this funding will not be expended this fiscal year, but will be required in later years of the five-year capital plan.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Medium Infrastructure, Page 263, Line 16 by \$2,000,000 from \$7,695,001 to \$5,695,001.</u> This project has experience some delays and this funding will not be expended fiscal year, but will be required in later years of the five-year capital plan.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Correctional Facilities Study, Page 263, Line 10 by \$300,000 from \$1,100,000 to \$1,400,000. The actual cost of the facilities study exceeded the enacted funding, thus the need for this amendment.

## **Military Staff**

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Asset Protection, Page 265, Line 22 by \$300,000 from \$1,000,000 to \$700,000.</u> This amendment will bring funding in line with projected spending based on the agency's current year plans.

Insert new line on Page 265, after Line 25 entitled "Middletown Armory Land Transfer" for \$700,000. This amendment is to provide funding to the Military Staff to compensate the RI Airport Corporation for the value of the long-term lease on a parcel of property adjacent to the Middletown Armory, upon which the Military Staff plans to construct a new building with Federal funds.

### Department of Environmental Management

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Dam Repair, Page 267, Line 31 by \$2,132,000 from \$2,382,643 to \$250,643.</u> This amendment will bring funding in line with projected spending on this project in the current fiscal year and shifts some of the funding to FY 2019 to continue Dam repair projects in progress, as reflected above.

<u>Increase Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Fort Adams Sailing Improvements/Mid-Park, Page 267, Line 34 by \$180,149 from \$1,819,851 to \$2,000,000.</u> This amendment requests additional funding for this project to complete upgrades to deficient docks and electrical systems.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Recreational Facilities Improvements, Page 268, Line 1 by \$1,490,000 from \$3,743,225 to \$2,253,225. This amendment will bring funding in line with projected spending on this project in the current fiscal year.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Galilee Pier Upgrades, Page 268, Line 2 by \$1,000,000 from \$1,278,767 to \$278,767. This amendment shifts \$550,000 from FY 2018 to FY 2019 and reduces funding in the current year based on projected spending.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Newport Piers, Page 268, Line 3 by \$110,000 from \$210,162 to \$100,162</u>. This amendment shifts funding from FY 2018 to FY 2019 due to delays in this project.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Natural Resources Offices/Visitor's Center, Page 268, Line 8 by \$823,000 from \$922,744 to \$99,744</u>. This amendment shifts \$500,000

from FY 2018 to FY 2019 and reduces funding in the current year due to delays in this project due to staff vacancies within the Department.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Marine Infrastructure/Pier Development, Page 268, Line 10 by \$350,000 from \$600,000 to \$250,000</u>. This amendment shifts \$250,000 from FY 2018 to FY 2019 and reduces funding in the current year based on projected spending.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – State Recreation Building Demolition, Page 268, Line 11 by \$100,000 from \$200,000 to \$100,000.</u> This amendment reduces funding based on projected spending this fiscal year. Assessments have been completed on several derelict structures, but actual demolition is not slated to happen until the summer of 2018.

### Coastal Resources Management Council

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Rhode Island Coastal Storm Risk Study, Page 268, Line 28 by \$150,000 from \$150,000 to \$0.</u> This amendment eliminates funding for this project in FY 2018 due to delays in getting the study underway. This funding is requested to be moved to FY 2021.

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Narragansett Bay SAMP, Page 268, Line 29 by \$100,000 from \$100,000 to \$0.</u> This amendment moves half of the funding to FY 2019 and half to FY 2020. A contract with the University of Rhode Island to undertake this study is being finalized, but not expenditures are anticipated prior to the end of FY 2018.

Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – Green Pond Dredging Study, Page 268, Line 30 by \$50,000 from \$50,000 to \$0. This amendment shifts funding for this project from FY 2018 to FY 2019 due to delays in this project.

### Department of Transportation

<u>Decrease Rhode Island Capital Plan Funds – T.F. Green Airport Improvements, Page 269, Line 18 by \$700,000 from \$2,000,000 to \$1,300,000</u>. This amendment reduces funding for the airport improvements based on the availability of other resources to the Airport Corporation.
