On page 21, line 34, after the language "returned.", by inserting the language "Chain of custody procedures for the voted mail ballots placed in the drop boxes shall be established and followed each night. A bipartisan pair of workers from the board of canvassers will open the drop boxes nightly and retrieve the voted ballots. The ballots will be counted, and the number recorded on an official document to be devised by the Rhode Island board of elections. Each election team member will witness and sign the document attesting to the accuracy of the count. The ballots will be placed in a locked receptacle and kept in a locked and secure location until that receptacle is opened to begin the process of compiling the names of early voters for posting for public notice. At that time, the ballots will be counted and the number recorded and the bipartisan pair will again sign the document detailing their contents. Each time the ballots are removed from the locked receptacle, this procedure must be followed."
