If the municipal retiree desires,

the retiree shall also be permitted to purchase coverage for his or her dependents. In any case, it is the responsibility of the retiree to obtain such health insurance and present proof of such insurance to the retirement system, which shall establish such rules and regulations as are reasonably necessary to carry out this section of law. Retirees purchasing health insurance under this section shall pay the full cost for such health insurance.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
