I hereby move to amend (00-S 2966) (Substitute "A" as amended) entitled "AN ACT RELATING TO MOTOR AND OTHER VEHICLES," as follows:

1. On page 2, delete line 25 and insert in lieu thereof the following language: "(3) The reason for the stop;"
2. On page 3, line 8, delete the words "January 1, 2001" and insert in lieu thereof the words "January 16, 2001".
3. On page 3, line 20, delete the words "twenty (20) months" and in lieu thereof the words "twenty-four (24) months".
4. On page 3, line 21, delete the words "twenty-four (24) months" and insert in lieu thereof the words "twenty-eight (28) months".
5. On page 3, lines 22 through 29, delete the following language: "provided, however, the time frame for the collection of data may be reduced if, after one year of data collection the Attorney General with the advice of the committee determine that the data collected within the first twelve (12) months is sufficient to form a conclusion as to whether racial profiling is or is not occurring, and the Attorney General promulgates a regulation which authorizes a reduction of the time frame pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act. In such event, the report required by this subsection shall be submitted not later than four (4) months after the data collection has concluded".
6. On page 4, line 4, delete the words "one (1) month" and insert in lieu thereof the words "ninety (00) days".
7. On page 4, line 6, delete the words "chapter" and insert in lieu thereof the word act
8. On page 4, line 10, immediately before the word "chapter," delete the word "the',and insert in lieu thereof the word "this".
9. On page 4, line 13, delete the word "additional".
10. On page 4, insert the following language between lines 14 and 15:

"(h) The department of attorney general shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter 37-2 of the general laws in connection with its procurement of equipment and services necessary to the implementation of this act."
