ARTICLE____

RELATING TO
RENTAL VEHICLE SURCHARGE

SECTION 1. Section 31-34.1-2 of the General Laws in Chapter 31-34.1 entitled "Rental Vehicle Surcharge" is hereby amended to read as follows:

31-34.1-2. RENTAL VEHICLE SURCHARGE. - (a) Each rental company shall collect, at the time a motor vehicle is rented in this state, on each rental contract, a surcharge equal to nine percent (9%) of gross receipts per vehicle on all rentals for each of the first ten (10) consecutive days. The surcharge shall be computed prior to the assessment of any applicable sales taxes, provided, however, such surcharge shall be subject to the sales tax.

(b) The surcharge shall be included on the rental contract and collected in accordance with the terms of the rental contract. The nine percent (9%) surcharge shall be allocated in the following manner: Fifty percent (50%) of said

surcharge three percent (3%) shall be retained by the rental company in accordance with this section and subsection (c), and fifty percent (50%) of said surcharge; three percent (3%) shall be remitted to the state for deposit in the general fund, on a quarterly basis in accordance with a schedule adopted by the tax administration one and one half percent (1 1/2%) shall be remitted to the airport corporation of Rhode Island to provide additional funding for the soundproofing program conducted by the corporation; and one and one half percent (1 1/2%) to be remitted to the city of Warwick to provide tax relief to homeowners affected by T.F. Greene Airport in a manner to be determined by the Warwick city council. Each rental company collecting and retaining surcharge amounts may reimburse itself in accordance with this section from the funds retained for the total amount of motor vehicle licensing fees, title fees, registration fees and transfer fees paid to the state of Rhode Island and excise taxes imposed upon the rental companies' motor vehicles during the prior calendar year; provided, however, that rental companies shall not be authorized to reimburse themselves for title fees, motor vehicle licensing fees, transfer fees, registration fees and excise taxes unless those fees and taxes shall have been assessed and paid in full to the state or appropriate city or town prior to any reimbursement. No reimbursement shall be allowed upon the prepayment of any fees or excise taxes.

(c) At a date to be set by the state tax administrator, but not later than February 15th of any calendar year, each rental company shall, in addition to filing a quarterly remittance form, file a report with the state tax administrator on such form prescribed by him or her, stating the total amount of motor vehicles licensing fees, transfer fees, title fees, registration fees and excise taxes paid by the rental company in the previous year. The amount, if any, by which the surcharge collections exceed the amount of licensing fees, title fees, transfer fees; registration fees and excise taxes paid shall be remitted by the rental company to the state of Rhode Island for deposit in the general fund.

SECTION 2. This article shall take effect upon passage.

SECTION 1. Section 45-26-4 of the General Laws in Chapter 45-26 entitled "Town Housing Authorities" is hereby amended to read as follows: 45-26-4. APPOINTMENT, TERMS, AND COMPENSATION OF COMMISSIONERS.

(a) When the town council adopts a resolution creating a town authority, the town council shall appoint five (5) persons as commissioners of the town authority provided, however, that the town of Lincoln shall appoint seven (7) persons as commissioners of the town authority. The commissioners who are first appointed shall be designated for terms of one, two (2), three (3), four (4), and five (5) years, respectively, from the date of their appointment, but, thereafter, commissioners shall be appointed for a term of office of five (5) years, except that all vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term, those appointments to be made to the town council.

Provided, however, that the commission members of the town authority of the town of Lincoln must be residents of the town of Lincoln during the term of their appointment. Provided, further, that at least one (1) of the commission members of a town authority must be a resident as well as a resident of a public housing facility during the term of their appointment. A public housing authority resident commissioner shall be appointed by the appointing authority from a list of nominees chosen in open election by the occupants of public housing. Upon the failure of the election process, there shall be a provision for an application process. Nothing herein shall be construed as preventing the appointing authority from appointing more than one resident of public housing to the commission.

(b) A commissioner of the town of North Providence receives twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per meeting but not in excess of five hundred dollar's (\$500) per year as compensation for his or her services; provided, that a commissioner of the town of Coventry only receives twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per attended meeting but not in excess of six hundred dollars (\$600) per year as compensation for his or her services, provided, further, that the chairperson of the Coventry housing authority receives thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) per attended meeting but not in excess of eight hundred forty dollars (\$840) per year as compensation for his or her services.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
