Senator Ruggerio seconded by Senators Lombardi and Goldin, offers the following written motion to amend.

FLOOR AMENDMENT

TO

2014 -- H 7021 SUBSTITUTE A AS AMENDED

AN ACT RELATING TO CRIMINAL OFFENSES -- SALE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO THOSE UNDER EIGHTEEN (18)

Madam President:

I hereby move to amend 2014 -- H 7021 SUBSTITUTE A AS AMENDED, entitled "AN ACT RELATING TO CRIMINAL OFFENSES -- SALE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS TO THOSE UNDER EIGHTEEN (18)", as follows:

1. By deleting all the language following the enactment clause, and by inserting in place thereof the following language:

"SECTION 1. Sections 11-9-13, 11-9-13.1, 11-9-13.4, 11-9-13.6, 11-9-13.7, 11-9-13.8, 11-9-13.10, 11-9-13.13 and 11-9-14 of the General Laws in Chapter 11-9 entitled "Children" are hereby amended to read as follows:

11-9-13. Purchase, sale or delivery of tobacco products to persons under eighteen -- Posting notice of law. -- No person under eighteen (18) years of age shall purchase, nor shall any person sell, give or deliver to any person under eighteen (18) years of age, any tobacco in the form of cigarettes, bidi cigarettes, cigars, little cigars, flavored cigars known as "blunts" unflavored "blunts", flavored and unflavored blunt wraps, cigarette rolling papers of any size or composition, cigarillos, and tiparillos, pipe tobacco, chewing tobacco, electronic nicotine delivery systems or snuff. Any person, firm, or corporation that owns, manages, or operates a place of business in which tobacco products are sold, including sales through cigarette vending machines, shall post notice of this law conspicuously in the place of business in letters at least three-eighths of an inch (3/8") high.

11-9-13.1. Cigarette and tobacco vending machines. -- (a) No cigarettes nor any other tobacco product nor electronic nicotine delivery system product shall be sold from any device or vending machine which is in an area not continuously supervised and in direct line of sight of an authorized person employed by the person, firm, or corporation that owns the business occupying the premises in which the device or vending machine is located, nor shall any tobacco product nor electronic nicotine delivery system product be sold from any device or vending machine which is in an area supervised by such an authorized person unless the device or vending machine is equipped with an electronic locking device which will not allow the device or vending machine to dispense a pack of cigarettes, or any other tobacco product, nor electronic nicotine delivery system product unless it is electronically unlocked from a secured position inaccessible to the public and under the supervision of an authorized person employed by the person, firm, or corporation that owns the business occupying the premises in which the device or vending machine is located. "Direct line of sight" means that the vending machine and the purchaser of cigarettes or electronic nicotine delivery systems must be visible to the authorized person pressing the unlock button while the unlock button is being activated. Provided, a locking device shall not be required in an establishment licensed to sell alcoholic beverages which limits access to persons over the age of twenty-one (21) years.

- (b) No cigarettes nor any other tobacco product <u>nor electronic nicotine delivery system product</u> shall be sold from any device or vending machine from which non-tobacco products are sold.
 - (c) No cigarettes shall be sold in packs which contain less than twenty (20) cigarettes.
- (d) Any person, firm, or corporation who owns a business occupying the premises in which a device or vending machine which dispenses cigarettes or any other tobacco product or electronic nicotine delivery system product is located who shall violate any of the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of this section shall for the first offense be subject to a fine of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00), for the second offense, be subject to a fine of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150), and for the third and any subsequent offense, be subject to a fine of five hundred dollars (\$500); provided, that in the event that there are no offenses in three (3) successive years from the date of the last offense, then the next offense shall be treated as the first offense.
- (e) Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate subsection (c) of this section shall for the first offense be subject to a fine of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00), for the second offense, be subject to a fine of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150), and for the third and any subsequent offense, be subject to a fine of five hundred dollars (\$500); provided, that in the event that there are no offenses in three (3) successive years from the date of the last offense, then the next offense shall be treated as the first offense.

- (f) One-half (1/2) of all the fines collected pursuant to this section shall be transferred to the municipalities in which the citations originated. One-half (1/2) of all the fines collected pursuant to this section shall be transferred to the general fund.
- (g) Severability. If any provision of this section or the application of it to any person or circumstance is held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this section, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this section are declared to be severable.

11-9-13.4. Definitions. -- As used in this chapter:

- (1) "Bidi cigarette" means any product that (i) contains tobacco that is wrapped in temburni or tender leaf or that is wrapped in any other material identified by rules of the Department of Health that is similar in appearance or characteristics to the temburni or tender leaf and (ii) does not contain a smoke filtering device.
 - (2) "Court" means any appropriate district court of the state of Rhode Island.
 - (3) "Dealer" is synonymous with the term "retail tobacco products dealer".
- (4) "Department of mental health, retardation and hospitals behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals" means the state of Rhode Island mental health, retardation behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals department, its employees, agents or assigns.
- (5) "Department of taxation" means the state of Rhode Island taxation division, its employees, agents, or assigns.
- (6) "License" is synonymous with the term "retail tobacco products dealer license" or "electronic nicotine delivery system license."
- (7) "License holder" is synonymous with the term "retail tobacco products dealer" or "electronic nicotine delivery system license."
- (8) "Person" means any individual person, firm, association, or corporation licensed as a retail dealer to sell tobacco products within the state.
 - (9) "Retail tobacco products dealer" means the holder of a license to sell tobacco products at retail.
- (10) "Retail tobacco products dealer license" means a license to sell tobacco products at retail as issued by the department of taxation.
- (11) "Spitting tobacco" also means snuff, powdered tobacco, chewing tobacco, dipping tobacco, pouch tobacco or smokeless tobacco.
 - (12) "Tobacco product(s)" means any product containing tobacco, including bidi cigarettes, as defined in

subdivision (1) of this section, which can be used for, but whose use is not limited to, smoking, sniffing, chewing or spitting of the product.

- (13) "Underage individual" or "underage individuals" means any child under the age of eighteen (18) years of age.
- (14) "Little cigars" means and includes any roll, made wholly or in part of tobacco, irrespective of size or shape and irrespective of whether the tobacco is flavored, adulterated or mixed with any other ingredient, where such roll has a wrapper or cover made of tobacco wrapped in leaf tobacco or any substance containing tobacco paper or any other material, except where such wrapper is wholly or in greater part made of tobacco and such roll weighs over three (3) pounds per thousand (1,000).
- (15) "Electronic nicotine delivery system" means an electronic device that may be used to simulate smoking in the delivery of nicotine or other substance to a person inhaling from the device, and includes, but is not limited to, an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe or electronic hookah and any related device and any cartridge or other component of such device.
- <u>11-9-13.6. Duties of the department of mental health, retardation and hospitals Duties of the department of behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals. --</u> The department of mental health, retardation and hospitals behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals shall:
- (1) Coordinate and promote the enforcement of the provisions of this chapter and serve as the primary liaison from this department to other state or local agencies, departments, or divisions on issues pertaining to stopping children's access to tobacco and electronic nicotine delivery systems.
- (2) Provide retail tobacco products dealers <u>and electronic nicotine delivery system dealers</u> signs concerning the prohibition of sales to children under eighteen (18) years of age. The signs, conforming to the requirements of this chapter, shall be sold at cost. This sign, or an exact duplicate of it made privately, shall be <u>displayed</u> in all locations where tobacco products <u>and/or electronic nicotine delivery systems</u> are sold.
 - (3) Investigate concurrently with other state and local officials violations of this chapter.
- (4)(i) Utilize unannounced statewide compliance checks of tobacco product sales <u>and/or electronic nicotine</u> <u>delivery system sales</u> including retail tobacco <u>and/or electronic nicotine delivery system</u> over-the-counter sales, mail order sales initiated via mail, facsimile, telephone or internet ordering or other types of electronic communications, and tobacco <u>and/or electronic nicotine delivery systems</u> vending machine sales as part of investigating compliance with the provisions of this chapter. Underage individuals, acting as agents for the department of mental health,

retardation and hospitals behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals and with the written permission of a parent or guardian, may purchase, with impunity from prosecution, tobacco products and electronic nicotine delivery system for the purposes of law enforcement or government research involving monitoring compliance with this chapter, provided that the underage individuals are supervised by an adult law enforcement official. Any individual participating in an unannounced compliance check of over-the-counter or vending machine sales, must state his or her accurate age if asked by the sales representative of the retail establishment being checked.

- (ii) In fulfilling the requirement of unannounced statewide compliance checks, the department of mental health, retardation and hospitals behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals shall maintain complete records of the unannounced compliance checks, detailing, at least, the date of the compliance check, the name and address of the retail establishment checked or the mail order company, the results of the compliance check (sale/no sale), whether the sale was made as an over-the-counter sale, a mail order purchase or a tobacco and/or or electronic nicotine delivery systems vending machine sale, and if a citation was issued for any violation found. The records shall be subject to public disclosure. Further, the department of mental health, retardation and hospitals behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals shall report to the owner of each retail establishment checked or mail order company, the results of any compliance check (sale/no sale) whether the sale was made as an over-the-counter sale, a mail order purchase or a tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery systems vending machine sale, and if a citation was issued for any violation found.
- (5) Seek enforcement, concurrently with other state and local officials, of the penalties as detailed in this chapter.
 - (6) Develop and disseminate community health education information and materials relating to this chapter.
- <u>11-9-13.7. Signs concerning sales to individuals under age eighteen (18). --</u> Signs provided by the department of behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals, or an exact duplicate of it made privately, shall: (1) Contain in red bold lettering a minimum of three-eighths (3/8") inch high on a white background the following wording in both English and Spanish:

THE SALE OF CIGARETTES, AND OTHER TOBACCO AND ELECTRONIC NICOTINE DELIVERY

SYSTEM PRODUCTS TO PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 IS AGAINST RHODE ISLAND LAW (Section 11-9-13.8(1), Rhode Island Statutes) PHOTO ID FOR PROOF OF AGE IS REQUIRED FOR PURCHASE.

(2) Contain the phone number at the department of behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals, where violations of sections 11-9-13.2 -- 11-9-13.19 can be reported, in addition to any other information

required by the department of behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals.

(3) Be displayed prominently for public view wherever tobacco products and electronic nicotine delivery systems are sold at each cash register, each tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery systems vending machine, or any other place from which tobacco products are sold. The signs shall be electronically available in both English and Spanish online at the department of behavioral healthcare, developmental disabilities and hospitals' website.

<u>11-9-13.8. Prohibitions applicable to license holders and their employees and agents.</u> A person that holds a license issued under chapter 20 of title 44 <u>and/or § 23-1-56</u>, or an employee or agent of that person, is prohibited from selling, distributing or delivering a tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery system product:

- (1) To any individual that is under eighteen (18) years of age; or
- (2) In any form other than an original factory-wrapped package; or
- (3) As a single cigarette sale (section 44-20-31), or as a sale of cigarettes by the individual piece, known as "loosies."

11-9-13.10. Prohibition on the distribution of free tobacco products. -- The distribution of free tobacco products and electronic nicotine delivery systems or coupons or vouchers redeemable for free tobacco or electronic nicotine delivery system products to any person under eighteen (18) years of age shall be prohibited. Further, the distribution of free tobacco products or electronic nicotine delivery systems or coupons or vouchers redeemable for free tobacco or electronic nicotine delivery system products shall be prohibited, regardless of the age of the person to whom the products, coupons, or vouchers are distributed, within five hundred (500) feet of any school. The attorney general shall bring an action for any violation of this section. Every separate free tobacco product or electronic nicotine delivery system or coupon or voucher redeemable for a free tobacco or electronic nicotine delivery system product in violation of this section shall constitute a separate offense subject to a fine of five hundred dollars (\$500). The penalty shall be assessed against the business or individual responsible for initiating the Rhode Island distribution of the free tobacco products or electronic nicotine delivery systems or coupons or vouchers redeemable for free tobacco products or electronic nicotine delivery systems.

11-9-13.13. Nature and size of penalties. -- (a) Any person or individual that violates a requirement of section 11-9-13.6(2), display of specific signage, shall be subject to a fine in court of not less than thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500) per civil violation. (b) The license holder is responsible for all violations of this section that occur at the location for which the license is issued. Any license holder that violates the prohibition of section 11-9-13.8(1) and/or (2) shall be subject to civil fines as follows:

- (1) A fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for the first violation within any thirty-six (36) month period;
- (2) A fine of five hundred dollars (\$500) for the second violation within any thirty-six (36) month period;
- (3) A fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and a fourteen (14) day suspension of the license to sell tobacco products or electronic nicotine delivery systems for the third violation within any thirty-six (36) month period;
- (4) A fine of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) and a ninety (90) day suspension of the license to sell tobacco products or electronic nicotine delivery systems for each violation in excess of three (3).
- (c) Any person that violates a prohibition of section 11-9-13.8(3), sale of single cigarettes; section 11-9-13.8(2), regarding factory-wrapped packs; shall be subject to a penalty of five hundred dollars (\$500) for each violation.
- (d) The department of taxation <u>and/or the department of health</u> shall not issue a license to any individual, business, firm, association, or corporation the license of which has been revoked or suspended, to any corporation an officer of which has had his or her license revoked or suspended, or to any individual who is or has been an officer of a corporation the license of which has been revoked or suspended so long as such revocations or suspensions are in effect.
- (e) The court shall suspend the imposition of a license suspension of the license secured from the Rhode Island tax administrator for violation of subdivisions (b)(3) and (b)(4) of this section if the court finds that the license holder has taken measures to prevent the sale of tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery systems to minors and the license holder can demonstrate to the court that those measures have been taken and that employees have received training. No person shall sell tobacco products and/or electronic nicotine delivery system products, at retail, without first being trained in the legal sale of tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery system products. Training shall teach employees what constitutes a tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery system product, legal age of purchase, acceptable identification, how to refuse a direct sale to a minor or secondary sale to an adult, and all applicable laws on tobacco sales and distribution. Dealers shall maintain records indicating that the provisions of this section were reviewed with all employees who conduct or will conduct tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery system products shall sign an acknowledgement form attesting that the provisions of this section were reviewed with him/her. Each form shall be maintained by the retailer for as long as the employee is so employed and for no less than one year after termination of employment. The measures to prevent the sale of tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery systems to minors shall be defined by the department of mental health, retardation and hospitals behavioral healthcare, developmental

disabilities and hospitals in rules and regulations.

11-9-14. Use of tobacco by minors. -- No person under eighteen (18) years of age shall smoke or chew use or possess when such possession is clearly visible tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery system in any public street, place or resort, any tobacco and/or electronic nicotine delivery system in any form whatsoever. Any person under eighteen (18) years of age violating the provisions of this section shall be required to perform up to thirty (30) hours of community service or shall be required to enter into a tobacco treatment program approved by any local substance abuse prevention task force, at the option of a minor charged with a violation of this section.

SECTION 2. Chapter 23-1 of the General Laws entitled "Department of Health" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following sections:

23-1-55. Electronic nicotine delivery system distributor, and dealer licenses required -- Definitions. –

(a) Definitions. – Whenever used in §§ 23-1-56 to 23-1-58, unless the context requires otherwise:

- (1) "Dealer" means any person whether located within or outside of this state who sells or distributes electronic nicotine delivery system products to a consumer in this state;
 - (2) "Distributor" means any person:
- (i) Whether located within or outside of this state, other than a dealer, who sells or distributes electronic nicotine delivery system products within or into this state. Such term shall not include any electronic nicotine delivery system products manufacturer, export warehouse proprietor, or importer with a valid permit, if such person sells or distributes electronic nicotine delivery system products in this state only to licensed distributors, or to an export warehouse proprietor or another manufacturer with a valid permit;
- (ii) Selling electronic nicotine delivery system products directly to consumers in this state by means of at least twenty-five (25) electronic nicotine delivery system product vending machines;
- (iii) Engaged in this state in the business of manufacturing electronic nicotine delivery system products or any person engaged in the business of selling electronic nicotine delivery system products to dealers, or to other persons, for the purpose of resale only; provided that seventy-five percent (75%) of all electronic nicotine delivery system products sold by that person in this state are sold to dealers or other persons for resale and selling electronic nicotine delivery system products directly to at least forty (40) dealers or other persons for resale; or
- (iv) Maintaining one or more regular places of business in this state for that purpose; provided, that seventy-five percent (75%) of the sold electronic nicotine delivery system products are purchased directly from the manufacturer and selling electronic nicotine delivery system products directly to at least forty (40) dealers or other

persons for resale;

- (3) "Electronic nicotine delivery system" means the products as defined in § 11-9-13.4(15).
- 23-1-56. License. -- (a) Each person engaging in the business of selling electronic nicotine delivery system products in the state, including any distributor or dealer, shall secure a license annually from the department before engaging in that business, or continuing to engage in it. A separate application and license is required for each place of business operated by a distributor or dealer. If the applicant for a license does not have a place of business in this state, the license shall be issued for such applicant's principal place of business, wherever located. A licensee shall notify the department within thirty (30) days in the event that it changes its principal place of business. A separate license is required for each class of business if the applicant is engaged in more than one of the activities required to be licensed by this section. No person shall maintain or operate or cause to be operated a vending machine for electronic nicotine delivery systems without procuring a dealer's license for each machine.
- (b) The director shall have authority to set a reasonable fee not to exceed twenty five dollars (\$25.00) for the issuance of the license.
 - (c) Each issued license shall be prominently displayed on the premises, if any, covered by the license.
- (d) The director shall create and maintain a website setting forth the identity of all licensed persons under this section, itemized by type of license possessed, and shall update the site no less frequently than six (6) times per year.
- (e) A manufacturer or importer may sell or distribute electronic nicotine delivery systems to a person located or doing business within the state, only if such person is a licensed distributor. An importer may obtain electronic nicotine delivery systems only from a licensed manufacturer. A distributor may sell or distribute electronic nicotine delivery systems to a person located or doing business within this state, only if such person is a licensed distributor or dealer. A distributor may obtain electronic nicotine delivery systems only from a licensed manufacturer, importer, or distributor. A dealer may obtain electronic nicotine delivery systems only from a licensed distributor.
- (f)(1) No license under this chapter may be granted, maintained or renewed if the applicant, or any combination of persons owning directly or indirectly any interests in the applicant:
 - (i) Is delinquent in any tax filings for one month or more; or
 - (ii) Had a license under this chapter revoked within the past two (2) years.
- (2) No person shall apply for a new license or renewal of a license and no license shall be issued or renewed for any person, unless all outstanding fines, fees or other charges relating to any license held by that person have been paid.

- (3) No license shall be issued relating to a business at any specific location until all prior licenses relating to that location have been officially terminated and all fines, fees or charges relating to the prior licenses have been paid or otherwise resolved or if the director has found that the person applying for the new license is not acting as an agent for the prior licensee who is subject to any such related fines, fees or charges that are still due. Evidence of such agency status includes, but is not limited to, a direct familial relationship and/or unemployment, contractual or other formal financial or business relationship with the prior licensee.
- (4) No person shall apply for a new license pertaining to a specific location in order to evade payment of any fines, fees or other charges relating to a prior license for that location.
- (5) No new license shall be issued for a business at a specific location for which a license has already issued unless there is a bona fide, good faith change in ownership of the business at that location.
- (6) No license or permit shall be issued, renewed or maintained for any person, including the owners of the business being licensed that has been convicted of violating any criminal law relating to tobacco products and/or electronic nicotine delivery system products, the payment of taxes or fraud or has been ordered to pay civil fines of more than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for violations of any civil law relating to tobacco products and/or electronic nicotine delivery system products, the payment of taxes or fraud.
- 23-1-57. Penalties for unlicensed business. -- Any distributor or dealer who sells, offers for sale, or possesses with intent to sell, electronic nicotine delivery system products, without a license as provided in § 23-1-56, shall be fined in accordance with the provisions of and the penalties contained in § 23-1-58.
- 23-1-58. Penalty for operating without a dealer license. -- (a) Any individual or business who violates this chapter by selling or conveying an electronic nicotine delivery system product without a retail license shall be cited for that violation and shall be required to appear in district court for a hearing on the citation.
 - (b) Any individual or business cited for a violation hereunder shall:
 - (1) Either post a five hundred dollar (\$500) bond with the district court within ten (10) days of the citation; or
 - (2) Sign and accept the citation indicating a promise to appear in court.
 - (c) An individual or business who has accepted the citation may:
- (1) Pay the five hundred dollar (\$500) fine, either by mail or in person, within ten (10) days after receiving the citation; or
- (2) If that individual or business has posted a bond, forfeit the bond by not appearing at the scheduled hearing. If the individual or business cited pays the five hundred dollar (\$500) fine or forfeits the bond, that individual

or business is deemed to have admitted the cited violation and to have waived the right to a hearing on the issue of commission on the violation.

(d) The court, after a hearing on a citation, shall make a determination as to whether a violation has been committed. If it is established that the violation did occur, the court shall impose a five hundred dollar (\$500) fine, in addition to any court costs or fees.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage. The amendments to §§ 11-9-13, 11-9-13.1,

11-9-13.4, 11-9-13.7, 11-9-13.10 and 11-9-14 shall take effect on July 1, 2014 and the

amendments to §§ 11-9-13.6, 11-9-13.8, 11-9-13.13, 23-1-55, 23-1-56, 23-1-57 and 23-1-58 shall

take effect on January 1, 2015."

AN ACT RELATING TO TOWNS AND CITIES - RETIREMENT OF MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES IN CENTRAL FALLS

Madam President:

I hereby move to amend 2014 -- S 2332 SUBSTITUTE A, entitled "AN ACT RELATING TO TOWNS AND CITIES - RETIREMENT OF MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES IN CENTRAL FALLS", as follows:

- By deleting all of the language following the enactment clause and inserting in place thereof the following:
 "SECTION 1. Chapter 45-21 of the General Laws entitled "Retirement of Municipal Employees" is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:
 - 45-21-67. Central Falls retirees settlement agreement. -- (a) Definitions.- As used in this section:
- (1) "Base pension benefit" is the amount listed on Appendix A, Appendix D-A and Appendix E-A attached to the settlement agreement, under the column labeled "annualized final base pension" which is the amount each Central Falls retiree was receiving as of July 31, 2011.
 - (2) "Central Falls retirees" are the retirees or the beneficiaries of retirees of the city of Central Falls listed on Appendix A to the settlement agreement, as amended from time to time when a retiree or beneficiary dies.
 - (3) "Settlement agreement" shall mean that settlement and release agreement, as set forth in Article 22 of the public laws of 2012, Chapter 241, signed by and between the receiver of the city of Central Falls, the director of revenue and the participating retirees, approved by the bankruptcy court by order dated January 9, 2012.

 (b) Legislative findings and purpose.
- (1) Pursuant to Article 22 of the public laws of 2012, chapter 241, which defined the terms of the initial appropriation, the state made an appropriation of two million six hundred thirty-six thousand nine hundred thirty-two dollars (\$2,636,932), which was deposited into a restricted account held by the city of Central Falls, for the purpose of supplementing the reduced pensions of the Central Falls retirees, to enable the city to pay the Central Falls retirees seventy-five percent (75%) of their base pension benefit as of July 31, 2011 for a five (5) year period, with the last supplemental appropriation to be paid on July 1, 2016.

- (2) The drastic pension reductions experienced by the Central Falls retirees provided a harsh example of the risks of unfunded pension liabilities, which in turn provided the primary incentive toward successful pension negotiations with other municipal, police and fire retirees, saving the state more than sixty million dollars (\$60,000,000);
- (3) If said appropriation is not made, as of July 2, 2016, the Central Falls retirees, many of whom sustained serious and permanent injuries in service to the city, will have their pensions reduced yet again, in some instances to less than sixty percent (60%) of the pension they were receiving on July 11, 2011;
- (4) It is fair and just that the state appropriate sufficient funds to the city to supplement the city's funding of the pension benefits to the Central Falls retirees to ensure that the Central Falls retirees continue to receive seventy-five percent (75%) of the base pension benefit, after taking into account all applicable cost-of-living adjustments, for their lifetime and to the extent applicable, for the life of their beneficiaries,

(c) Appropriation payment.

- (1) Appropriation payment and restrictions on use. In accordance with the terms set forth in Article 22 and the settlement agreement, the state shall annually appropriate sufficient funds to the restricted account for the city of Central Falls to supplement the city's funding for payments to Central Falls retirees in order that they continue to receive seventy-five percent (75%) of their base pension benefit as of July 31, 2011, after taking into account all applicable cost-of-living adjustments, for their lifetime and to the extent applicable, for the life of their beneficiaries.

 Such appropriation shall be determined annually by an actuarial valuation ("appropriation amount"), and it is expected over the life of the existing retirees to total four million eight hundred seventeen thousand seven hundred eight dollars (\$4,817,708).
 - (2) Deposit of appropriation payment and payments to Central Falls retirees. The appropriation payment shall be immediately deposited by the city into the previously established "participating retirees restricted five (5) year account" which shall be redesignated as the "participating retirees restricted account." The participating retirees account shall be administered by the city and not by any third-party pension fund manager.
 - (d) Any and all withdrawals, transfers and payments from the participating retirees account shall be made as set forth in the settlement agreement and accompanying appendices and said Article 22 (c) until the payments are made on July 1, 2016.
- (e) Beginning on July 1, 2017 and bi-annually thereafter, with payments to be paid each retiree or beneficiary as applicable on July 1 and January 1 of each year they are eligible for benefits under the Central Falls pension plan,

the city shall distribute to each participating retiree or beneficiary one half (½) the annual amount listed on the actuarial spreadsheets prepared by Sherman Actuarial Services, which shall supplement the pension payments paid by the city in order that each retiree will receive seventy-five percent (75%) of their base pension benefit, after taking into account all applicable cost-of-living adjustments, for their lifetime, and to the extent applicable, sixty-seven and one-half percent (67.5%) of the base pension benefit, after taking into account all applicable cost-of-living adjustments, to their beneficiaries for their lifetime.

- (f) Relationship to base pension payments. The supplemental payments to the Central Falls retirees from the participating retirees' restricted account shall not be included in the calculation of base pension benefits for the purposes of determining a retiree or beneficiaries cost of living adjustment.
 - (g) The cost of living adjustments as set forth in the settlement agreement are to be paid by the city of Central Falls to the Central Falls retirees, and to the extent applicable, their beneficiaries.
 - (h) The following provision shall amend and supersede Article 22 (c)(4) regarding the balance in the participating retirees restricted account as of July 2, 2016:
- (1) Distribution of balance. As of July 2, 2016, no further supplemental payments shall be distributed to the Central Falls retirees under the terms of the settlement agreement. The balance of monies in the participating retirees restricted account shall be distributed in accordance with this Article, in the amounts and to those retirees and beneficiaries listed on the actuarial spreadsheets prepared by Sherman Actuarial Services, LLC and maintained and administered by the city. The amounts set forth on the actuarial spreadsheets will supplement the pension payments being made by the city in order that each retiree will receive seventy-five percent (75%) of their base pension benefit, after taking into account all applicable cost-of-living adjustments, for their lifetime, and to the extent applicable, sixty-seven and one-half percent (67.5%) of the base pension benefit, after taking into account all applicable cost-of-living adjustments, to their beneficiaries for their lifetime.
 - (2) Any monies remaining in the participating retirees restricted account after the last living retiree attains seventy-five percent (75%) of the base pension benefit, after taking into account all applicable cost-of-living adjustments, or last living beneficiary attains sixty-seven and one-half percent (67.5%) of the base pension benefit, after taking into account all applicable cost-of-living adjustments, shall be returned to the state under state law.
- (i) Access to account information and records. The city shall maintain appropriate account information and records relating to all receipts into, maintenance of, and distributions from the participating retirees' restricted account, and shall allow at all reasonable times for the full inspection and copying and sharing of information about such

account and any and all payments therefrom with any participating retiree and the state.

(j) Unclaimed payments. Any monies distributed to a participating retiree or beneficiary from the participating retirees' restricted account and not claimed by a participating retiree or beneficiary after the city has exercised good faith attempts over a six (6) month period to deliver it to the best last known address of such participating retiree or beneficiary, shall not escheat under state law, but shall remain in the participating retirees' restricted account until the conditions of subsection (h) herein have been satisfied.

(k) Liabilities and penalties for inappropriate use of appropriation payment. Any person, whether in his/her individual capacity, who uses, appropriates or takes or instructs another to use, appropriate or take, the appropriation payment, or any portion thereof, that is not specifically used for making payments to participating retirees or their beneficiaries as required hereunder and under the terms of the settlement agreement, shall be personally liable for repayment of said funds and further shall be subject to any and all applicable civil and criminal sanctions and/or penalties for such act(s).

SECTION2. This act shall take effect upon passage."

CURRENT LABORATORY TESTING FOR LYME DISEASE CAN BE PROBLEMATIC AND STANDARD LABORATORY TESTS OFTEN RESULT IN FALSE NEGATIVE RESULTS, AND IF DONE TOO EARLY, YOU MAY NOT HAVE PRODUCED ENOUGH ANTIBODIES TO BE CONSIDERED POSITIVE BECAUSE YOU'RE YOUR IMMUNE RESPONSE REQUIRES TIME TO DEVELOP ANTIBODIES. IF YOU ARE TESTED FOR LYME DISEASE AND THE RESULTS ARE NEGATIVE THIS DOES NOT NECESSARILY MEAN YOU DO NOT HAVE LYME DISEASE.
