Madam President:

I hereby move to amend 2015 -- S 0303, entitled "AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH AND SAFETY -- PUBLIC HEALTH AND WORKPLACE SAFETY ACT", as follows:

1. On page 3, lines 13 through 15, by deleting the language "The establishment must ~~annually~~ quarterly demonstrate that revenue generated from the serving of tobacco products is greater than the total combined revenue generated by the serving of beverages and food.", and by inserting in place thereof the language: "Effective July 1, 2015, all existing establishments and establishments that open thereafter must demonstrate quarterly, for a period of one year and annually thereafter, that the annual revenue generated from the serving of tobacco products is greater than fifty percent (50%) of the total revenue for the establishment, and the serving of food, alcohol or beverages is only incidental to the consumption of such tobacco products."
