AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH CARE FACILITIES - LICENSING

Mr. President:

I hereby move to amend 2017 -- S 0577 SUBSTITUTE A, entitled "AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH CARE FACILITIES - LICENSING", as follows:

1. On page 1, between lines 4 and 5, by inserting the following language: "[\(1\) "Affiliate" means a legal entity that is in control of, is controlled by or is in common control with another legal entity.](#)"

2. On page 1, line 5, by striking the language "(1)", and by inserting in place thereof the language "[\(2\)](#)".

3. On page 1, line 12, by striking the language "(2)", and by inserting in place thereof the language "[\(3\)](#)".

4. On page 2, line 2, by striking the language "(2)(i)(A) – (2)(i)(D)", and by inserting in place thereof the language "[\(3\)\(i\)\(A\) – \(3\)\(i\)\(D\)](#)".

5. On page 2, line 3, by striking the language "(3)", and by inserting in place thereof the language "[\(4\)](#)".

6. On page 2, line 19, by striking the language "(4)", and by inserting in place thereof the language "[\(5\)](#)".
