Beyond the immediate need to protect community health, the expedited timeline and negligible public comment opportunities early in this facility's process have severely damaged the community relationship with the Quonset Development Corporation (QDC), an entity critical to both the town and state economy. Passing this bill without an expiration date will give the community the confidence that a new pyrolysis plant under a different LLC is not waiting right around the corner. This foundational safety is a critical precursor to bolstering and repairing the QDC-North Kingstown relationship that has served the state so well over the last several decades.

I strongly support passage of an amended version of S3224 removing the sunset provision, and I respectfully ask that you vote this bill out of committee and recommend passage by the full Senate this legislative session.

Residents of North Kingstown have made it clear that they do not want a sewage sludge pyrolysis facility in their community. Public comments and permit materials have raised substantial concerns regarding emissions including mercury, benzene, and numerous additional hazardous pollutants identified in the facility's air permit application. These concerns are amplified by the facility's proximity to homes, schools, businesses, and the area's sole-source aquifer.

This legislation is necessary not only to address the current proposal, but also to prevent similar facilities from reappearing under different ownership structures in the future. Removing the expiration date provides certainty to the community and establishes a clear long-term policy direction for Quonset and Rhode Island.

The handling of this proposal has also created significant public distrust due to the speed of the process and the limited opportunities for meaningful public input during the early stages. Passing this legislation would help restore confidence between the public and the Quonset Development Corporation, which remains an important economic asset for the state.
