RE: SJR 2657 Joint Resolution Urging the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management to Study and Regulate the Impact of Wake Boats on Rhode Island Public Waterways

Dear Chairwoman Sosnowski,


Thank you for providing the Department of Environmental Management (DEM) the opportunity to comment on SJR 2657, which urges DEM to complete a study on the impacts of wake boat operations on Rhode Island's freshwater lakes, ponds, and reservoirs, and to regulate the use of wake boats on state waters. DEM cannot implement the requirements of this legislation to complete a comprehensive scientific study with existing resources. However, DEM is considering regulating the use of wake boats at lakes and ponds with a state nexus such as those with state boat launches or located within state properties.

A wake boat is a specialized watercraft designed to create large wakes used for water sports such as wakesurfing and wakeboarding. As wake boats have become more popular there have been concerns raised about the impacts they have on the waterbodies where they are used. SJR 2657 would urge DEM to "complete a comprehensive scientific study on the environmental, ecological, shoreline, water quality, invasive species, and public safety impacts of wake boat operation on Rhode Island's freshwater lakes, ponds, and reservoirs." While such a study could be useful to understand the impacts of wake boat usage, we note that completing it would require retaining the services of outside consultants and DEM does not have existing resources that could be used for this purpose. Furthermore, other states have completed similar studies that DEM can use to better understand the impacts of wake boats on lakes and ponds.
