SCHOLARSHIP ACT - Support

Onward We Learn respectfully submits this testimony in support of Senate Bill 2094, which would revise the Onward We Learn Scholarship Act. The legislation stipulates that any enacted funds from the Rhode Island Promise Scholarship (Title 16 Chapter 107) and Rhode Island Hope Scholarship (Title 16 Chapter 113) in a given fiscal year that went unspent upon the conclusion of the respective academic year would be provided to Onward We Learn for any scholarships that the organization has paid on behalf of its students who have attended either CCRI and/or Rhode Island college in that respective fiscal year.

Onward We Learn brings the strongest evidence base in Rhode Island when it comes to impact in college access and success programming. Our recent longitudinal study shows that students who participate in Onward programming are 48% more likely to graduate from high school on time and earn a college degree within six years compared to closely matched peers. This level of impact is rare and underscores the effectiveness of sustained, out-of-school time interventions.

The funds associated with this legislation will allow Onward We Learn to sustain this proven model, reach more students, and contribute meaningfully to Rhode Island's goals of increasing educational attainment and economic mobility. Moreover, these resources are critical in helping Onward We Learn and the State of Rhode Island demonstrate the 100% match requirement associated with the state's federal GEAR UP from the U.S. Department of Education.

A 17-year Study on the Postsecondary Outcomes for Onward We Learn Participants (2007-2024)

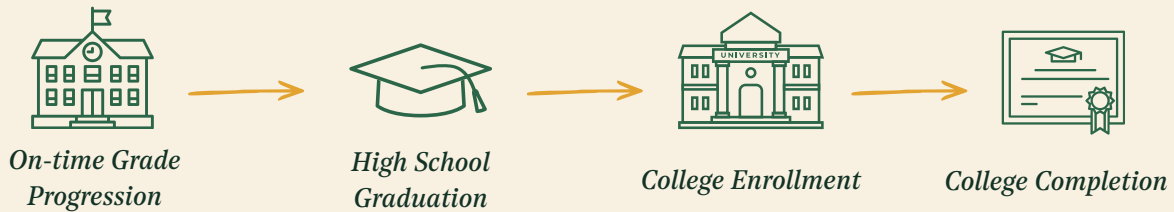
An educational journey of Onward We Learn GEAR UP students from middle school through college.

Onward We Learn GEAR UP participants in Rhode Island were 48% more likely than their closely matched peers to earn a college credential within six years of expected high school graduation.

Across every major milestone, Onward participants significantly outperformed comparison students.

A total of 745 Onward GEAR UP participants were matched to 745 comparison-group peers using Propensity Score Matching based on demographic and educational characteristics.

Students were followed from 6th grade through six years after their expected high school graduation via the RI Longitudinal Data Systems (RILDS) and National Student Clearinghouse data.

**An estimated 55,000 data points from RILDS were used in this analysis.*
